A marriage license has been issued to Orwin Krotzsch and Mrs. John Glarner.

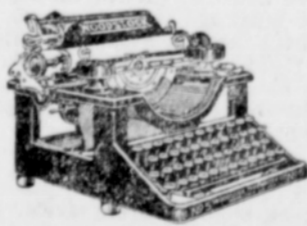
A. H. Ritzan took suddenly ill last Sunday and is confined to her bed.

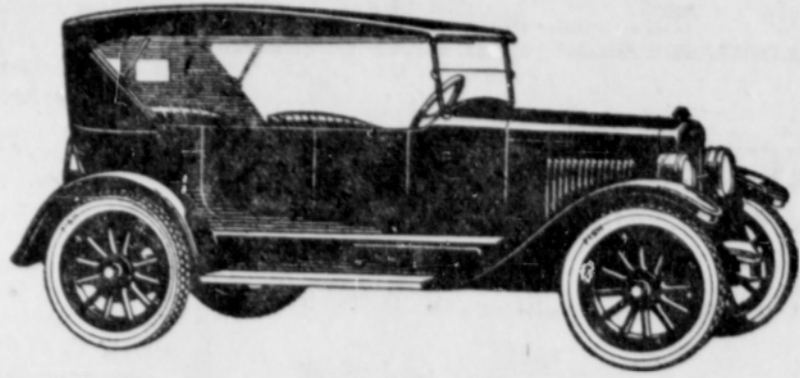
