Who Wants Its Repeal?

There is an agitation to repeal the criminal syndicalism law under which a number of offenders have been sent to the penitentiary and others face trial.

The law makes it a criminal offense to belong to a society that advocates the destruction of government by violent and criminal means.

Parlor Bolsheviks, who join such a society because of their devotion to principles of philosophical anarchy are not entitled to any sympathy when they get into trouble about it.

If you join in a society that has for its avowed object the felonious purpose to burn my house and murder my servants you cannot plead in defense that you remained at home when the deed was done.

There certainly is no agitation for the repeal of this law by law-abiding American citizens. The mere fact that it is keeping "Big Bill Haywood" and others of his like in Russia, where they are dodging penitentiary sentences for their activity in this country is sufficient grounds for not repealing it.

Finding Jobs for Families.

The United States Labor Bureau is taking constructive steps toward bringing together the farmer and the man looking for a job.

To give a specific illustration it has appointed a representative of the Salem, Oregon, Y. M. C. A. to register requirements of farmers and to take names of men, women and children seeking employment. Both parties turn their names in to this man and he in turn brings the employer and the employe together. This is being done early in the season to facilitate the handling of farm crops.

As most farmers furnish good camp grounds, free wood, water and other conveniences, it is the aim of the Labor Department to try and encourage more "family work" in other words, father, mother and children, on the farms this coming season. It is an excellent idea and eliminates many abuses that have crept into professional employment agencies.

It is hoped that this undertaking will prove a success at Salem and other points in the country where similar offices will be established. One should be established at Gresham where families can find employment in the berry fields.

power is about that of the fast-depreciating German mark, it is impossible to say.

"Newman is not forgetting his American citizenship, for when on this ranch he discovered a nest of about 100 eagles he changed Karakala, the name given the ranch by the late Czarina, to Eagle Ranch. Here, with the aid of Leonard Harthill, O. A. C. '12, together with American tractors, they are turning virgin soil for part of the food for the 25,000 orphans in American care in the Caucasus. They have already demonstrated they can double the ordinary crop."

"If Newman can secure the consent of the Soviet Government, he expects to have allotted to some of his older boys a tract of from five to ten acres for their individual cultivation. Not satisfied with tinkering with a deadly plague, a public utility and a 15,000-acre ranch, Newman's next project is to divert an entire mountain stream to Eagle Ranch to provide water power and such irrigation as is needed in its extensive agricultural development. He has found that a large volume of water heretofore wasted can be diverted at a very low cost and put to large use."

"No state in the Union has a finer group of workers in the Near East than Oregon and you should count it a privilege to give money, food and clothing to back up such folks as Dr. Lovejoy, Miss Hinman, Mrs. Cruikshank, Mrs. Burt and the Newmans, all of whom are adding glory to your state by their service."

Gresham friends will remember Mrs. Cruikshank who was a resident of South Roberts avenue two years ago.

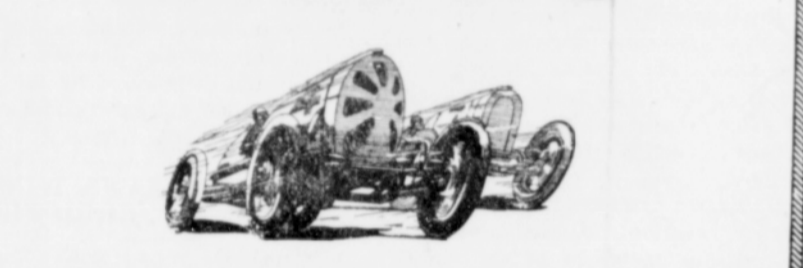
