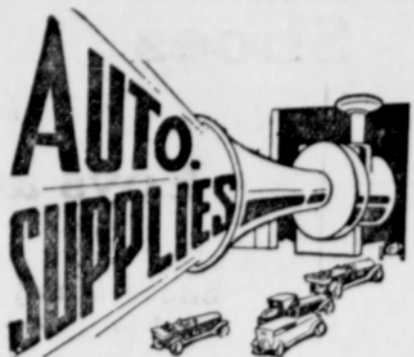

### UPPER GRADE PUPILS ARE ASKED TO MEET

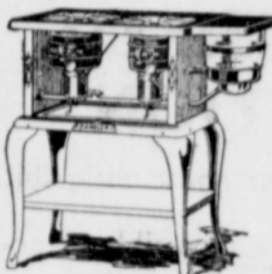

Quicksall of the Gresham grade school has called for an assembly of the pupils of the seventh and eighth grades Monday morning, Sept. 17, at 9 o'clock, at Metzger's hall, over the Gresham Drug store. 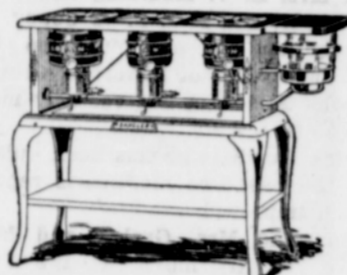

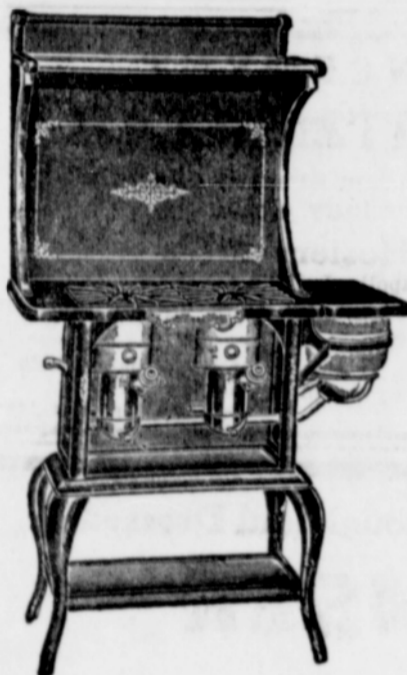

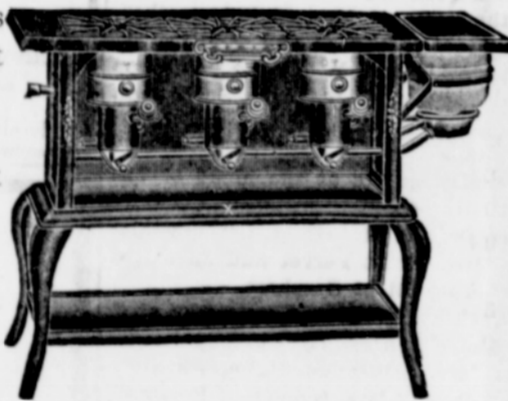
