Pacific Cooperative Wool Growers Win Suit.
By a decision handed down by Judge Bingham in the circuit court of Linn county, Pacific Cooperative Wool Growers obtained a signal victory in a suit against one of its members, J. T. Woody of Brownsville, Oregon, who had sold his 1922 wool clip in an outside buyer in violation of his marketing agreement with the association. The case has been in the courts since July of 1922. The association was awarded liquidated damages of ten cents per pound on all wool sold outside the association, attorney's fees and court costs. The defendant attacked the validity of the organization of the association. The court found that the association was legally organized and that the contract with its members was binding and enforceable.

Defendant contended that the association was not entitled to any relief in a court of equity because he has sold all of his sheep and had gone out of the sheep raising business. But the court decided that as Woody owned sheep at the time the suit was filed, and at that time plaintiff was entitled to relief in a court of equity, the association was entitled to damages, costs and attorney's fees even though the defendant owned no more sheep and did not intend to own any.
