F. H. CRANE ELECTED.

In the Rockwood water district election yesterday F. H. Crane was elected commissioner to succeed George E. Barr, resigned. There were 88 votes cast.

FORMER SANDY CITIZEN BURIED AT DAMASCUS

Funeral services were held Thursday at Kentworthy mortuary parlors for J. H. L. Maybee, who died at his home in Lents on November 26, aged 72 years and one day. The Rev. E. A. Smith was in charge of the services. Interment was in Damascus cemetery beside his parents and brother. The pallbearers were John Revenue, Geo. Beers and George Maroney of Sandy, Ed. Siefert of Boring, Chas. Tillman and Mr. Mull of Portland.

Mr. Maybee spent many years at Sandy, where he was identified with the development of that place. He was born in Cattaraugus county, New York, November 25, 1851. He went with his parents to Kansas when a child and there married Mary J. Cook of Woodson county on June 29, 1871. He moved to Gresham in 1889 and two years later went to Texas where his wife died, May 27, 1883. He soon moved back to Oregon and in 1884 took a homestead at Sandy. On April 8, 1888, he married Miss Minnie S. Cline of Bull Run, who survives him. He is also survived by two children of the first marriage, Alf. L. Maybee of Gresham and Mrs. Lottie Forbes of Redondo, California, and two of the second marriage, Mrs. Alma D. Maroney of Sandy and Lloyd Maybee of the family home. Mrs. Loesa M. Hedges of Portland is a sister.

STEELHEADS RUNNING IN TILLAMOOK BAY

The advance guard of the gamey steelhead, fresh from the depths of the Pacific ocean, says the Tillamook Herald, is now running in the bay, and a few are coming up the rivers and streams, their movement being assisted by the recent heavy rains that have prevailed. The small mountain streams are getting all swollen up now, and the steelhead which is both a salt water and a fresh water fish, but not a salmon, nevertheless, is chasing up the creeks to the haunts that it knew when as a baby fish it wiggled about in the shallow fresh water pools, and escaped being a meal for the big crane, the kingfisher and other bird enemies that inhabit the coast rivers and streams. Several local fishermen have taken steelheads this week on a troll. They are reported to be fat and fine.
