**THE U. S. ON WHEELS.**

Motor car registrations in 1923 in the United States increased more than 23 per cent over 1922. The total registration for the year just closed is 15,221,272 passenger cars and trucks, which is one for every seven or eight persons. Ten years ago there was one for every 70.

It is estimated that about a million cars were discarded in 1923 and that the production in 1924 will have to be a million and a half to keep up with the demand.

Four states have over a million registrations. They are, New York, California, Ohio and Pennsylvania.

Oregon is 27th in the list with 166,412 registrations, one in five of the population. Oregon's increase over the preceding year was 23.6 per cent.

The lowest registration is in Nevada with 15,700, which, however, was a 22 per cent increase over 1922.

These figures show the extent of automobile manufacturing and use along with the production of accessories, oils, gasoline, and the filling station and garage business.

Based on an estimated value of \$700 each the people of this country has an investment in motor cars of over ten billion dollars.

The United States is away ahead of all other countries in use of motor cars.

In fact, every man, woman and child in the whole country could be loaded into autos and on trucks, with provisions for a day and take one big holiday trip—the whole United States on wheels.

Premier Nikolai Lenine, Russia's great bolshevik leader, died January 22 at his country villa near Moscow. He is considered the greatest rebel of all time, over-throwing the all powerful Russian czar and establishing a soviet or communistic rule for 130,000,000 people. His associate, Leon Trotsky, is still practically out of government affairs.

Tau Kappa Epsilon was organized in 1899 at Illinois Wesleyan university. It has 19 chapters. Tau chapter has 26 active members and four pledges. Tau Sigma Phi was organized at O. A. C. as the Deschutes club in 1919.

Altman is a freshman in commerce. He was graduated from the Union high school in June, 1921.

M. G. Godwin was one of the members of Tau Kappa Epsilon present at the installation of the new chapter of the fraternity on the O. A. C. campus. Godwin is a member of the Beta chapter at the James Millikan university at Decatur, Illinois. He is at present taking work in the dairy department here.

Mrs. Godwin was in Corvallis to attend the formal installation ball of Tau Kappa Epsilon.

In every direction growth here is amazing.

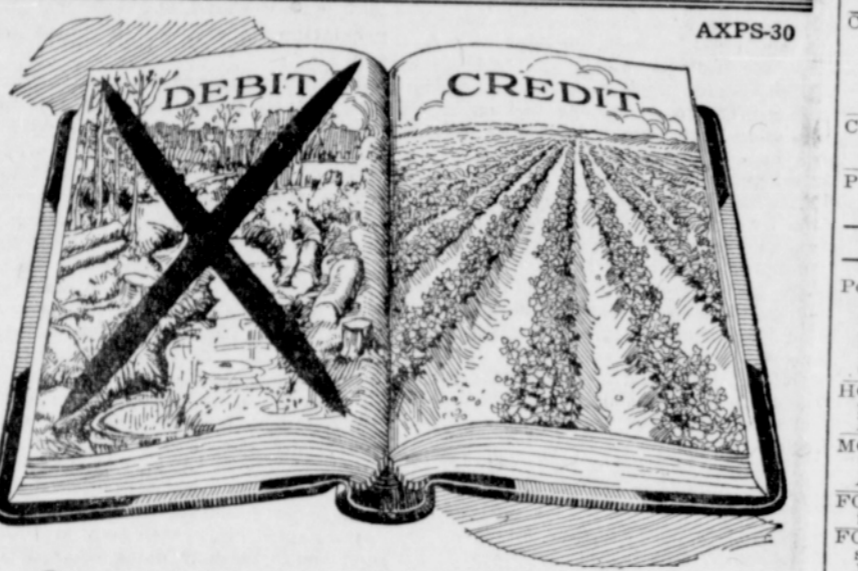
Follow the proceedings of the American Association for Advancement of Science at Cincinnati. The meeting teaches these things:
