CITIZENSHIP RIGHTS TO INDIANS

Already two-thirds of the entire Indian population of the United States enjoy the privileges of citizenship, the actual number being around 200,000.

The door of citizenship will be opened to approximately 125,000 Indians if a bill introduced in congress by Chairman Snyder, of the house committee on Indian affairs, becomes a law. It is endorsed by Commissioner Burke of the Indian office and favorably reported by the committee on Indian affairs.

The bill authorizes the Secretary of the Interior at his discretion to issue a certificate of citizenship to any non-citizen Indian born within the territorial limits of the United States who may apply for it. Upon the issuance of the citizenship, the bill states, "he or she shall be a citizen of the United States." A proviso stipulates that the citizenship shall not in any manner impair or otherwise affect the right of the Indian to tribal and other property.

In explanation of the fact that 125,000 Indians are not now citizens of the United States, Commissioner Burke said that under the present laws they could not achieve citizenship unless they left their reservation, separated themselves from their tribes and took upon themselves the habits and mode of living of white people.

The Snyder bill will permit the Indians to obtain a citizenship certificate from the Secretary of the Interior, regardless of whether they reside on reservations and regardless of their present mode of living.

Dog Gets Silver Medal.

Recently the Oregon Humane society decorated a Silverton collie with a silver medal for finding his way home unaided from Wolcott, Indiana, 3,000 miles away.

A committee of prominent society women decorated Bob with the medal, properly inscribed, in the presence of an assembly of 600 school children in the Silverton high school.

As a protest against the cruel and inhuman dog laws of Oregon, the entire assembly by a standing vote declared that Bob had earned his freedom and should no longer be kept a prisoner on a chain.

"Sweetart" is the name suggested for Oregon and Washington prunes which are, as all who have tried them know both tart and sweet. The name "Mistland," so extensively used, is inadequate and misleading.

A Premium on Idleness.

The Saturday Evening Post tells the story of an eastern textile manufacturer of middle age who rebelled against high surtaxes. He closed his mill, liquidated his capital and put the proceeds into tax-free securities. He now spends his time in travel and recreation. This is what he says about it:

"Why should I keep factory hours, subject my capital to the risks of business, wear myself out in the daily grind, and then hand over 58 per cent of my profits to the federal government, and another large slice to the state and local tax collectors? My tax-free bonds yield me more dollars than I can call my own than my business did before I gave it up. The government that penalized me when I was a useful and productive citizen now puts a premium on my idleness."

The Green amendment to the constitution which has been before congress, to do away with future issues of tax-exempt bonds was defeated on February 8, 1924, by the narrow margin of seven votes less than the two-thirds required.

Many speakers who opposed the amendment spent more time abusing those who favored it than in presenting economic arguments against it.

Lazy wealth will enjoy another year of idleness in tax-exempt bonds, but public demand for a square deal in taxation grows stronger every year.
