WE NEED HIM NOW.

There are ten or a dozen men who seek to be county commissioners. Several are out for the four years term, or Rudeen's place when his term expires next January 1. Mr. Rudeen is a candidate to succeed himself. Those who have filed for the four-year term, except Rudeen, are also recall candidates for the same office in case Rudeen is recalled. There are several candidates for election on the recall ballot to be voted on along with the recall at the special election in connection with the primaries on May 16.

Every voter should carefully consider the candidates and the conditions in connection with the recall and the nomination of a county commissioner for the four-year term. Thus confusion can be avoided and intelligent and safe action taken to help the county out of the tangle which has arisen over the bridge deals.

If there were no recall election it would be necessary to nominate and elect only one county commissioner for a four-year term.

If the recall carries, as it undoubtedly will, it will be necessary to elect (not nominate) a man for each of the three places thus made vacant. A recall candidate runs against a certain man who is being recalled, and the man elected serves out the unexpired term of the commissioner recalled. In the case of Walker and Rankin this would be about two and a half years. In the case of Rudeen about six months.

For example, Rufus Holman is up for nomination for the regular term of four years. He is also a candidate for election on the recall against Rudeen. If elected on the recall he would serve out Rudeen's term and if nominated on May 16 and elected at the regular election next November Mr. Holman would continue to serve for the four-year regular term beginning next January.

The whole situation is such that it becomes unusually important to select the right man.

Mr. Holman is a man of unquestioned integrity, mentally and physically qualified for the hard tasks before the board of county commissioners. He is a man of large affairs and would handle a five million dollar bridge job with the same honesty and ability that he would a five dollar job of ruling or binding at his hindery—and he has done it. The interstate bridge was a bigger job than the present proposed bridges and was built at a saving of nearly \$200,000 to the taxpayers.

He has the experience, having served as county commissioner for ten years.

In the present emergency, Rufus Holman is the man.

We need him now!
