JAPANESE EXCLUSION AND BUSINESS.

While the senators and congressmen are fretting over the effort of the president and others to delay the Japanese exclusion act, recently passed, to become effective next July 1, the chamber of commerce of the United States yesterday pledged un-animously its support to the efforts to bring about friendly relations and an amicable understanding with Japan on the question of immigration. It is believed too hasty enforcement of the act which has already roused Japan will hamper business dealings between the two countries.

The question involved touches the Pacific coast more directly than any other section. It is here the majority of Japanese settle; it is here their presence is felt to be a menace and is most strongly objected to, and it is here merchants and manufacturers would first feel anything like a retaliation on the part of the Japanese. We don't want more Japanese, yet we want their business. The situation calls for wise and careful action. We believe the president is justified in his stand.

ARMENIANS AND CITIZENSHIP.

Are natives of Armenia eligible to citizenship in the United States? More than ten thousand have been naturalized. There were in 1920 more than 52,000 Armenians in the United States.

A suit has been brought by the government against Tatos Cartozian of Portland, contesting his right to citizenship. The case is being tried in the federal court before Judge Wol-verton and naturally involves all other naturalized Armenians in this country.

The whole question, it is said, rests upon the contention whether or not Armenians belong to the "white" race or are of Asiatic origin. It harks back to 1790 and what was understood by white race at that time when the original naturalization law was passed.

The testimony at the trial is very interesting and the issue is of great importance. However decided in this case, without question an appeal will be taken to the supreme court.

Coolidge has won the California nominating vote over Hiram Johnson. It grows more and more certain he will be the republican nominee at the Cleveland convention in July. There is no question as to Oregon's nominating vote next Friday.

Agriculture Basis of All Industries. "To be a friend of agriculture it is not necessary to be an enemy of any other legitimate interest," writes A. D. Fairburn, contributing editor of the Farmers' National Magazine, in an article treating of the ability, industry and sincerity of United States Senator McNary and of his friendship for and activity in the interests of the farmer. "The position of the senior senator from the far western state is that a prosperous agriculture will assure all other well managed and needful industry against prostration. It is because of this knowledge that Senator McNary has applied himself so diligently to the study of farming in its relation to finance, to transportation and to foreign and domestic commerce."
