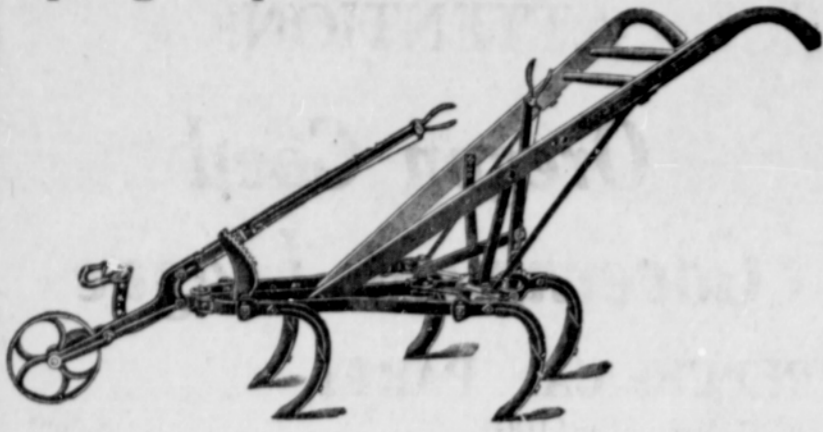

GRESHAM SCHOOLS NAME NEXT YEAR'S TEACHERS

Teachers for the Gresham schools have recently been elected by the school boards and plans for another year are already being formulated.

The entire high school faculty was re-elected with the exception of Mrs. Margaret Miller Lewis, who was not a candidate for re-election. Her place has not yet been filled. School will begin September 8.

The board authorized the use of two of the school busses by County Club Agent Kinder for the transportation of club boys and girls to the summer school at Corvallis.

Paper towels will be substituted for linen for the use of the pupils at the high school. It is believed that the paper will be considerably less expensive than the linen.

All other teachers of the school are retained for another year.
