ENQUIST FOR FISH PROTECTION.

E. A. Enquist, eastern Multnomah's candidate for the state legislature, is a fisherman on the upper Columbia and a farmer, so is informed as to the farmers problems and the fishermen's needs.

He regards the Columbia river from its mouth to The Dalles as one of Oregon's most important salmon streams. He says there should be a closed season for salmon on the Columbia to permit the fish to reach the upper river spawning grounds. He believes it would benefit all the fishermen.

He thinks there is often too much politics in connection with the work of the fish commission and that the commission should be put on a business basis as its purpose is to protect one of the largest business resources of the state.

Mr. Enquist is in close touch with the interests of eastern Multnomah county and would be a safe and able man on the Multnomah delegation in the legislature.

GEORGE L. RAUCH FIGHTS METERED PHONE SERVICE

On the republican primary ballot, among candidates for the state legislature, voters will find the name of George L. Rauch. He is a well known, clean cut, straight forward, vigorous young attorney of Portland, and has held positions of trust for which he has qualified himself by loyalty and ability.

He isn't seeking to be United States senator or congressman or aspiring to a judgeship or anything like that, though personally he believes him better qualified for any of these places than some who are running.

Mr. Rauch wants to go to the state legislature and his main reason is entirely one of public interest to combat the proposal to put all business phones in the city on a metered service.

As is known, the public service commission has issued an order saying, "It is practicable and necessary in order to remove the unjust discrimination that now exists by virtue of the enforcement of the present flat rates on business phones that the Pacific States Telephone and Telegraph company should at once prepare for the installation of measured service for business phones."

Mr. Rauch says that this is only a step toward introducing this kind of service generally on residence phones as well as business. He has made a careful study of the question and says it will greatly increase the cost of phones which is high now; that it will not improve the service and is a needless burden.

Mr. Rauch is making his campaign mainly on this issue. But he is a great Oregon booster, thoroughly alive and trustworthy. He should be nominated and elected.

Mr. Rauch has been speaking on this subject before various organizations in Portland and at meetings in the county.
