"LIBERALISM"

The Oregon Liberal has appeared, volume one, number one, under date of August 20. It is a weekly newspaper published in Portland, or rather it is a political and campaign paper published in the interests of La-Folletteism in Oregon. It represents itself as a John the Baptist crying in the wilderness. Its attitude is that nearly everything is all wrong with Oregon and the nation and Liberalism is the cure-all and is put over against "standpatism."

That is not the true issue, at all. From the standpoint of the liberalist, standpatism is only loyalty to existing party affiliations.

In this case liberalism is only another name for socialism, for La-Follette, while not a socialist as to party, is socialistic in his ideas.

The reason we thing this is so is from a remark in this first issue of the Liberal.

Here it is; read it yourself:

"As earnestly as we know how we desire to reiterate the sole editorial motive for this experiment—the sole reason for the experiment, to discover if liberalism in Oregon is dead, or if maybe U'Ren did something more than add a few dozen new sorts of laws to the code."

The real issue is between liberalism and conservatism. These two must always work as opposite tendencies in politics.

This is not a time for socialistic liberalism on radicalism but for common sense conservatism, and this latter is what Coolidge and Dawes stand for. They are good men to tie, to put at the head of this government for the next four years, instead of the "experiment" of LaFolletteism.
