CITIZEN AWAY FROM HOME MAY CAST VOTE

Oregonians may vote even if away from their own precincts on election day. It is pointed out by the Republican State Central committee.

Because of the livestock show at Portland closing just before election day, it is thought a number of persons may not return home in time to vote and the way this can be accomplished is pointed out.

Anyone who expects to be at a distance from home on election day should provide himself with a certificate of registration that he may obtain from his county clerk.

In case the absent voter has not obtained a certificate, it will be required that he swear in his vote. This can be done in Multnomah county by six freeholders, but in other parts of the state, two freeholders may make affidavit.
