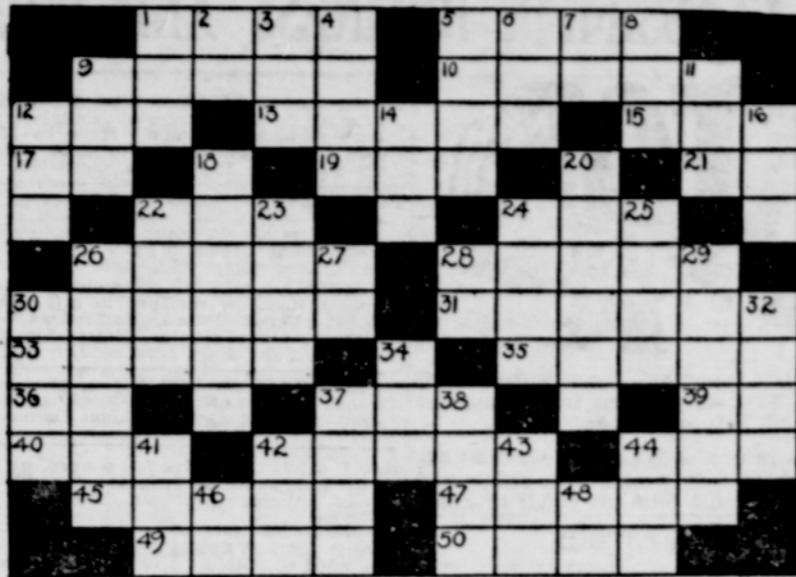


SMITH-HUGHES TEACHER WINS FAVORABLE NOTICE

CHRISTMAS CANDIES.

Honey Creams.

Put one cupful of sugar, one-half cupful of boiling water, and two table-spoonsful of honey in a saucepan. When the sugar is dissolved, add one-half tablespoonful of butter. Cook slowly to 238 degrees fahrenheit, or until it forms a soft ball when tried in cold water. Pour the syrup slowly over the well-beaten white of one egg, beating constantly. Add one teaspoonful of vanilla. Beat until thick and creamy. Drop from a spoon on buttered or wax paper. Place a half walnut on each piece.

Velvet Fondant.

Chop fine one cupful of Maraschino cherries, drain and dry in a warm place. Put two cupfuls of sugar, three-fourths cupful of cream, and one-eighth teaspoonful of cream of tartar in a saucepan and cook to 238 degrees fahrenheit, or until it forms a soft ball when tried in cold water. Allow to cool, then beat until creamy. Add one-half cupful of chopped walnuts, the dried Maraschino cherries, and one teaspoonful of vanilla. Beat until stiff, then knead well. Make into a long roll, cut in pieces, and place on wax paper to dry.
