MEMORIAL TO SAM'L K. BARLOW.

A bronze tablet, memorial to Samuel K. Barlow, has been placed at Government Camp, on the Oregon Trail, by the Sons and Daughters of the Pioneers. Mr. Barlow, in 1846, built and opened a road over the Cascade mountains, on the south side of Mount Hood. The dedication services for this tablet will be held in conjunction with those for the new Mt. Hood Loop highway, some time in the late summer, under the auspices of the Sons and Daughters of Pioneers. The land upon which the marker has been placed will soon be deeded to the state. Members of the committee in charge are: Harvey Starkweather, chairman; Mrs. D. P. Thompson, Mrs. Mary Barlow Wilkins, ex-officio; Leslie Scott, Mrs. W. B. Crane and George H. Himes.

THE FARMERS' IDLE HOUR.

Henry Ford, who makes ten instead of two blades of grass grow where one grew before, and sometimes where none grew before, has said that farming should be done in 20 days. This coupled with Edison's vision of 20 years ago, which disclosed a manufacturing rural community, plus the present condition of the farmer, brings sharply to the front a situation of significance.

Every day the farmer is being chased out of the fields by his own machinery. Due to improved methods of operation he can raise more food than the world can eat. The result is he is always selling on a glutted market. Finally he rushes into the city and the city man would rush away from it if he knew where to go or what to do.

Thoughtful review of the farmer's situation leads one to the belief that his relief will come not in legislative legislation, but in the adjustment of his business to the electrical age which is now beginning to take its place in our economic life. There is only one answer to the poor condition of the farmer plus the high cost of living for the urban population, namely the elimination of the idle hour. The times of planting, cultivating and harvesting are his productive periods. For the rest, his time and investment are waste that must be spread over the volume of his product. If our farms were equipped with small manufacturing plants that could be kept busy producing standardized necessities, such for example as screws, nails, bolts, shoe laces, knife handles and a thousand and one other products, then the rainy day would be one of activity and profit instead of one of loafing at a loss. One of these days Mr. Ford will work out the problem and the idle hour will be abolished.

FOUR TIMES AND OUT!

For the fourth time in 34 years, the United States Geographic Board has ruled against changing the name of Mount Rainier to Mount Tacoma. This ruling was made public in the report of November 13, 1924.

The name Rainier, the report declares, is of world acceptance and to change it would be unreasonable. Evidences pro and con are specifically and carefully stated and this formal decision has again been given.

A bill introduced by Senator Dill, changing the name to Mount Tacoma, was passed by the senate at the last session of congress. It is now pending before the house public lands committee, which refused to hold hearings at the last session until a report had been received from the National Geographic Board.
