The editor learned his trade as a printer largely with the same company in St. Paul for which Mr. Moore worked for over 50 years. All of which impresses us with the fact that while years count big yet time is fleeting; the boy of yesterday is the man of affairs today and the man of affairs today is retired tomorrow.

President Coolidge, in an address before the cotton manufacturers of the country remarks that the return of skimp skirts may affect the consumption of cloth. There is no prospect as he sees it of stabilizing styles but the tendency to change may relieve monotony and add spice to life.

E. E. Brodie, our minister to Siam since 1921, has tendered his resignation to President Coolidge and will return to Oregon City where he is publisher of the Enterprise. Mr. Brodie is prominent in the state as publisher and leader in civic development.

The French government is making a desperate effort to tide over a financial crisis. It has a public debt of nearly fourteen billion dollars, nearly two billion of which is short term obligations. France's assessable wealth is placed at about \$22,500,000,000. This means she is in a bad way financially and has resorted to a capital levy of ten per cent of the nation's wealth.
