As a bright April sun was flooding the hillsides and valleys with its light and warmth, with flitting clouds flecking the sky, with all nature decorated for the happy occasion, with birds singing their love songs and natural fountain throwing their spray about them, the happy young couple began life united.

Mrs. P. Anderson, of Corbett, an Outlook correspondent, writes of the occasion in the following picturesque language:

"Even cupid took a chance on the highway yesterday and two young persons from Portland were married on the bridge that spans the creek in front of the world renowned Multnomah Falls. Indeed, it must have been romantic for the bride and groom to have God's wonderful nature in all its glory for a bridal setting, with thousands of birds chanting their love message and the great Multnomah sending a tiny spray of its pure water gently touching the contracting couple who pledged that henceforth they be as one until death separates them."

APRIL IN U. S. HISTORY.

If the United States ever engages in another war let us hope it will be begun in April. April is our lucky month in this respect. Five of our six great wars had their beginning in this month of April and the exception, the war of 1812, was the only good one which was not a complete victory.

April was given an appropriate name by the Romans. The word comes from the Latin word "aperire," meaning to open, because, in the north temperate zone it is the season of the opening of buds and flowers.

It is sad that this beautiful season should ever have been desecrated by the opening of war. But sin, crime and war know no seasons or sacredness. One is as good as another for their purpose. But let us hope that neither April nor any other month will be stained by the blood of another war.

Of course, the magazine is strongly republican but more strongly American and always interesting and informative. Congratulations, Mr. Lockwood, on the improvement.

Portland is the center of the lumber industry in the northwest and is the largest lumber exporting port in the world. The exports in 1924 amounted to \$50,500,000 feet. The increase has been steady from year to year. The shipments of lumber from Portland go to the principal ports in Europe, the Orient, Australia and other ports. The lumber cut of Portland's 23 mills in 1924 amounted to \$10,000,000 feet with the cut of the Inman-Poulsen mill of 200,000,000 feet, probably the largest of any single mill unit in the world.

Aged Swedish Pastor Dies in Spokane.

The Rev. Magnus Anderson, aged 89 years, a retired pastor of the Swedish Mission church, died at the Bethany Home for the Aged in Spokane, Washington, Thursday morning, from influenza. The deceased, who is an uncle of Mrs. Karl Hagberg of Powell Valley, was well known in this vicinity where he had formerly lived and where he had visited many times since leaving for the Home at Spokane four years ago. His wife died seven years ago. Mr. Anderson came from Sweden to Minnesota and Wisconsin in 1902, coming to Oregon about nine years later. He served numerous preaching charges in the east but his work in Oregon had been confined to supply work. He is survived by three sons, P. M. Magnuson of Warrenton, Oregon, and Andrew and John Magnuson of Ashland, Wisconsin. He also leaves a daughter, Miss Karin Anderson in Sweden.

The funeral services were conducted Sunday afternoon at 2 o'clock at the Mission church by the Rev. O. J. Wilner, with interment in Douglas cemetery. The church was well filled to honor the memory of the aged pastor who was so well known in the community. But one of his children, P. M. Magnuson, of Warrenton, was present at the funeral. The Rev. O. J. Wilner delivered an address in which he paid a high tribute to the deceased and solos were rendered by Mrs. Karl Hagberg and John Vicklund.
