the mature women in the art of home making, care of children and kindred subjects.

The ignorance of the masses in China is deplorable, says Miss Shoemaker. Many are yet unaware of the fact that a republican form of government was declared 13 years ago. There are not many newspapers and possibly in a village of 500 not more than one or two can read a paper. Their law courts amount to little. There is practically no redress for a woman from the cruelties to which she may be subjected and as a natural consequence, suicide is very common among them. The mission doctor, as a common occurrence, is hurriedly summoned to the bedside of a woman who "has taken something."

The address of Miss Shoemaker was made more interesting by the addition of snapshots which were passed around the room. A rising vote of thanks was extended to her for her talk. Refreshments were served by Mrs. E. G. Judd, assisted by Mrs. A. J. W. Brown and Mrs. H. S. Clow.
