GROW ROSES.

Gresham ought to have a favorite flower. It should be one of striking beauty and variety of color. It should be one that will be easily handled and make a good display.

To adopt a favorite flower does not preclude each individual growing any or all other varieties desired.

This is something to which our flower experts should give their attention. The Outlook would like to have suggestions from any who think on this subject.

In the meantime we suggest that more attention be given to growing roses. The rose is one of our choicest flowers and does exceedingly well here.

In the vicinity of Gresham is one of the largest commercial rose farms in the country, the Mountain View Floral Farm, on the Base Line road near the Sandy river. From this farm carloads of rose plants are shipped each year besides furnishing a large supply for the local market.

Home owners in this locality should take advantage of the opportunity and be liberal in the display of this choice flower.

CHANGES IN POSTAL RATES.

The following changes in domestic postal rates which went into effect April 15, 1925, are given for the benefit of Outlook readers.

LETTERS—Miscellaneous written or typewritten matter, New Rate 2c per ounce. No change.

POSTAL CARDS (Government Issue)—New Rate 1c each. No change.

POST CARDS—Private mailing cards, minimum size 2 3/4 x 4 inches, maximum size, 3 9/16 x 9 1/16 inches. New Rate 2c each. Either written or printed.

PRINTED CARDS—Larger than Government Post cards, New Rate 1 1/2c per 2 ounces; 2c if they bear the words "Post Card" or "Private Mailing Card."

DOUBLE, OR REPLY POST CARDS (not government), each portion, New Rate 2c each. Postage need not be prepaid on reply portion.

COMPLETE NEWSPAPERS and MAGAZINES (mailed by public) New Rate 2c per 2 ounces. If over 8 ozs. mail as parcel post.

BOOKS and CATALOGS, (24 pages or over and 8 ounces or less), New Rate 1 1/2c per 2 ounces.

SEEDS, PLANTS, Bulbs, Roots, etc., (8 oz. or less), New Rate 1c per 2 ounces.

MISCELLANEOUS PRINTED MATTER (8 ounces or less), New Rate, 1 1/2c per 2 ounces. Also see rate for books, catalogs.

MISCELLANEOUS PRINTED MATTER (over 8 ounces and including Books, Catalogs, Newspapers, Magazines), Parcel Post Rates.

PARCELS, (8 ounces or less) includes all mailable matter except as described above, New Rate 1 1/2c per 2 ounces. Formerly at 1c per ounce or at the pound zone rate.

PARCEL POST. Parcels over 8 ounces. (All mailable matter except written or typewritten). New Rate, Parcel Post Rate, old rate plus 2c per parcel. All parcels over 8 ounces, except those collected on rural routes require 2c postage in addition to old Parcel Post rates.

Postage Rates to foreign countries are Not Changed.

Special Services. All fees for Special Services, except Money Orders, are in addition to the postage and must be paid by Stamps Affixed.

SPECIAL HANDLING—(Parcels over 8 ounces, obtain letter service when so marked and prepaid.) 25c in addition to postage. Endeavor "Special Handling" in proximity to stamps.

SPECIAL DELIVERY—(To procure immediate delivery at office of destination) 2 pounds or less, 10c. 10 pounds or less, 15c. Over 10 pounds 20c.

INSURANCE FEES—New Rates (includes Canada) Values to \$5.00—5c. Values to \$25—8c. Values to \$50—10c. Values to \$100—25c.

C. O. D. FEES—New Rates (Domestic Destinations) Amount to \$10—12c. Amount to \$50—15c. Amount to \$100—25c.

REGISTRY FEES—New Rates, Value to \$50—15c. Value to \$100—20c. Until further advised the increased registry fees will not apply to Canada, Cuba, Mexico or Panama.

POSTAGE STAMPS, 1/2c and 1 1/4c denominations, obtainable either cancelled or uncanceled.
