GETTING NEW SETTLERS.

Will J. Roberts, high school principal at Ontario, Oregon, has been selected to manage an "Oregon Bureau" to be maintained at Green River, Wyoming, by the land settlement and publicity departments of the Oregon development fund during the coming tourist season, it was announced by W. G. Ide, manager of the land settlement department.

The Wyoming office will be the fourth established by the land settlement department outside of Portland, the previous three including the Los Angeles bureau, and the two "gateway" offices at Ashland and Ontario, in Oregon.

Eighteen new settlers, coming from six states and one Canadian province, were located in Oregon during the first ten days of this month, according to Mr. Ide. These settlers purchased 397 acres of land and invested a total of \$37,645.

LEGION ENDOWMENT FUND.

On the day war was declared with Germany, Enoch B. Carlson, a postal employe in Portland, Oregon, beat his 31st birthday by 13 days and enlisted in the army. He was commissioned from the first officers' training camp at The Presidio, San Francisco, and sailed for the war zone December 13, 1917. He finally was assigned to the military police of the 6th corps, then he saw duty in the Meuse-Argonne. He returned to the states June 30, 1919.

Today Carlson lies ill in the U. S. Veterans' Hospital No. 94, American Lake, Washington, where he has been since August, 1924, when the American Legion aided him. Before that he was in the hospital at Boise, Idaho.

There are thousands of war veterans who today need attention and for whom the American Legion, in conjunction with government agencies, is trying to obtain permanent cure. It is the continuation of its endeavor to aid disabled veterans, and for the care of veterans' orphans, that the American Legion Endowment fund of \$5,000,000 is being established. Oregon is now working to raise this state's share of the fund.

The Legion's persistent efforts obtained hospitalization for Carlson. Recently he has been critically ill. He was sick three years before he obtained hospitalization, or enough compensation to take care of him.

Carlson has been unable to work since 1920. He tried vocational training at Oregon Agricultural College, but after six weeks was forced to give it up. The Legion was appealed to and aid was obtained.
