OFF FOR THE POLE!

A doughty explorer is Amundsen, in 1912 he discovered the south pole; now he is off in an airplane dash to set foot on the northern axis of the globe.

To Peary is accorded the honor of being the first to reach the north pole. His arrival at that coveted spot is recorded for April 6, 1909.

Amundsen's attempt will be the first to be undertaken by the use of airplanes. Two planes are being used by the exploring party of six.

The hop-off was made yesterday. From the starting point at King's Bay, Spitzbergen, the distance to the pole is 600 miles. It was hoped to cover this distance in 24 to 48 hours.

If Amundsen succeeds he will be renowned indeed for he will be the first to have visited both poles of our planet.
