SCHOOL LAW DECISION.

The I-told-you-sos now have their inning. The United States supreme court has passed upon Oregon's compulsory school law and sustains the decision of the trial court that the law is unconstitutional.

The court held that the law violated a fundamental theory of American liberty and in addition was confiscatory. The decision was unanimous and was written for the court by Associate Justice McReynolds.

"As often heretofore pointed out our rights guaranteed by the constitution may not be abridged by legislation which has no reasonable relation to some purpose within the competency of the state.

"The fundamental theory of liberty which all governments in this union repose excludes any general power of the state to standardize its children by forcing them to accept instruction from public teachers only."

The decision will be a disappointment to those who sponsored the movement which was undoubtedly aimed against the parochial schools though it also had a broader purpose to standardize primary education and develop a more patriotic citizenry.

The fight for the law engendered a good deal of bitterness on account of the outcropping of religious prejudice. This was not at all commendable but the testing out of the principles involved has, we believe been a good thing and will doubtless bear fruit in this and other states of the union.

Dozen, Not "Pound"

In a recent bulletin giving the grades under the new egg-grading law the word "pound" was inadvertently used in place of "dozen," making the statement that fresh eggs should weigh not less than 1.5-6 ounces, or 22 ounces to the pound. It should have read 22 ounces to the dozen.
