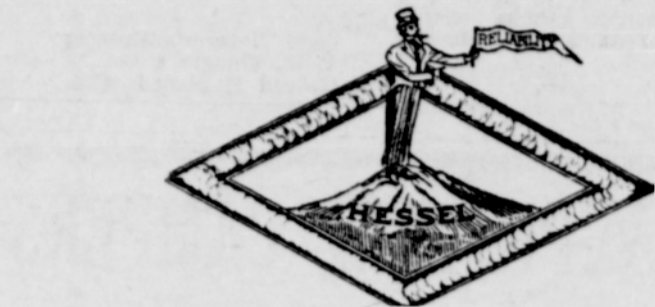

FATAL AUTO ACCIDENT OCCURS NEAR GRESHAM

Another fatal automobile accident has occurred in the vicinity of Gresham when on late Saturday afternoon Carl O. Jones, a structural steel worker of Hardin, Montana, suffered injuries which resulted in his death 24 hours later at St. Vincent's hospital. In company with a friend, Cecil Fletcher, the unfortunate man was taking a ride over the Mt. Hood loop highway and when at a point near the residence of Larry Jessen near Welch's Spur it is said that Jones became dissatisfied with the speed at which the car was traveling and suddenly pulled the hand throttle down, although the other man was doing the driving. The car gave a terrific lurch forward and before Fletcher could slow it down, it hit a sharp curve and went over the bank. The machine rolled over four times and came to a standstill on the body of Jones, whose back was broken.

An auto and motorcycle collided on Main street in Gresham Sunday afternoon but nothing more serious than bruises resulted, although the motorcycle was damaged to the extent of about \$25. Harold Hudson, son of the postmaster at Troutdale, was proceeding north on Main street when a machine came from East Second street with the intention of turning south on Main. The vehicles clashed and the boy went over the top of his motorcycle according to reports of bystanders and landed on his side, bruising his face considerably and hurting one of his legs. The driver of the machine, whose name could not be learned, fared better than the boy and was able to proceed on his way at once. Evidently the affair was about 50-50 and no blame seemed to be attached to either side.

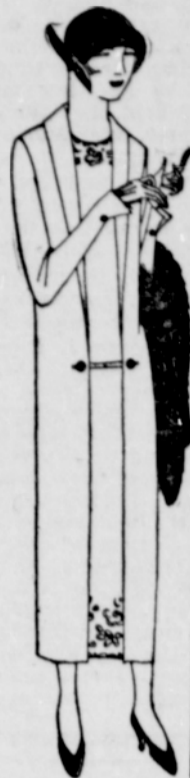
