DIVORCE GRANTED WIFE OF NOTORIOUS BURGLAR

Mrs. Wm. Still was granted a divorce in the Oregon City courts last week from her convict husband, who is serving a seven-years' term in the state penitentiary at Salem. Still was shot and captured at Troutdale several months ago when he attempted to hold up the pool hall at that place. This was the last of a series of robberies, and following his capture he confessed to a number of them, including an attempt to hold up the Estacada bank.

A strange problem arises in this connection, as it is held by many that Still was not the only man implicated in that plot, and that he was not actually the masked man who entered the bank and attempted to rob it. Still claims that he alone was guilty, but several witnesses, who know him personally claim that it was another man who commanded two women to hand over the cash and who was frightened out when one of them went to the window and called for help. There were several men across the street, and this doubtless caused the robber to run.

The one woman in the bank claimed the robber was not Still. He insisted that he was. Corroborating the woman in the bank this witness who encountered the robber on the street and saw him get onto the running-board of the car and the car drive away without the robber entering it, held that the robber carried his revolver in his left hand. According to all obtainable evidence, Still was and is right handed.

It is believed by intimate acquaintances of Still that once he has served his penitentiary sentence he will tell the true story of the crimes in which he participated, and that when he does it will be found that others were implicated in the Estacada affair.

Mrs. Minnie Frances Still obtained her divorce on the grounds that her husband is a convict confined in the state penitentiary.
