NATIONAL DEFENSE DAY.

This year throughout the country the Defense day test is to be made on July 4. It seems most fitting to combine the celebration of American independence with a test of the loyalty of our citizenry and a removal of the pledge of our willingness to defend our institutions against invaders and make a test of our military strength in case of a national call.

Again it must be said the object is not militaristic. It is a reminder and exhibition of preparation and pledge of loyalty.

It has been impossible for the Outlook to find out what plans have been made locally to carry out the spirit and letter of the plan announced by the government. Those having it in charge have made no definite announcement but there is no doubt of the loyalty of our citizens. The community is strongly patriotic. Our various organizations and the support given them put us near the front as a patriotic community. Last year the plan suggested was in the nature of an enrollment and a public gathering with patriotic addresses.

This year the general plan includes the use of the radio, broadcasting patriotic addresses by prominent men by which means it is estimated twenty million people will be reached with information and stirring appeals pertaining to our national defense program. More about this is given in a news story.

Last year Defense day was observed in connection with Armistice day. President Coolidge objected to this plan for this year and it was decided at a late date to combine it with Independence day. The shortness of the time probably accounts for the lack of working out a more definite local plan.

Last year the enrollment of this locality was 300 and these are considered enrolled for this year also unless names are definitely withdrawn.

Hence this year we will in spirit, if not in fact, hold up our hand again and swear continued allegiance to our country.
