WILLIAM JENNINGS BRYAN.

The great Commoner is gone. His appealing eloquence is stilled, with his sturdy defense of principles which were dearer to him than life. He was an apostle of universal peace, temperance, honesty in political dealings, and faith in the inspired Word of God. Indeed, it is conceded that the strain of the trial through which he has just passed hastened his death. He threw his very soul into the cause he espoused.

Bryan's political allegiance was given to the democratic party, of which he was ever a faithful exponent. Three times he was given the nomination for the presidency of the United States. As a favorite platform orator he had few equals. Disappointment seemed but to nerve him for greater efforts.

Born in Illinois in 1860, he studied law, was a successful editor, and was for two years Secretary of State in President Wilson's cabinet.

PROSPECT BRIGHT FOR BUMPER PICKLE CROP

The local plant of the Oregon Pickle & Canning company has been enlarged during the past few weeks with an addition of 50x200 feet. This has been divided into two parts, the front room which is 50 feet square to be used as a receiving and packing room, and the rear part of the added structure which is 50x150 feet in size to house 40 storage tanks.

This building of more shed room was made necessary by the increase in acreage which is fully 25 per cent over that of last year. According to J. L. Stafford, manager of the industry, the Gresham unit is to be the centralized manufacturing plant, the cucumbers received at the other two places, Molitor and Molalla, to be salted down and placed in storage tanks there to await shipment to the Gresham plant, at which place they will be manufactured into pickles and shipped to various points throughout the northwest and eastern sections of the country.

Mr. Stafford reports the cucumber crop as the best in years, the abundance of late rain, followed by the extreme warm weather producing just the right climatic conditions necessary for a bumper crop. Delivery started at the Gresham plant on the 16th of this month, at Molalla on the day previous and at the Monitor plant on the 7th of July. H. S. Harvey is the largest grower in the Gresham section. He has great faith in the cucumber future, having a planting this year of 15 acres. Picking was under way on Thursday with 25 pickers in the field.

A sorting machine has been added to the equipment of the plant at Gresham which will greatly facilitate the handling of the cucumbers and will also insure a more accurate sorting as to size and grade, with this machine, which is electrically propelled, the cucumbers of all sizes are placed on a slowly revolving belt and as this line passes in front of the worker, she selects a certain-sized cucumber from the pile and places it in a receptacle. This is done all along the line until no cucumbers remain on the belt. More and better work is accomplished by this method than by the old sorting by hand, also the result is more uniform in size.

The buildings on the premises of the plant have been painted a neat gray which greatly improves their appearance. It will require about 20 persons, 10 men and 10 women, to handle the tonnage at the factory this year, about double the force of last year, on account of the increased acreage.

EARLY MORNING FIRE TAKES BORING PROPERTY

A disastrous fire of undetermined origin visited the home and place of business of S. E. Waller and also the home and garage of Mr. and Mrs. F. M. Morgan at Boring on Monday about 3 o'clock in the morning, burning the places to the ground and threatening other property nearby. When Waller awoke the whole back of his hall was ablaze. It was a frame structure about 46x70 feet in size and contained besides his living quarters a store and confectionery, also pool room and barber shop. The rear of the building consisted of an amusement hall and moving picture house and contained besides seats a new player piano and a picture machine. With a companion, Sam Gregson, Waller was enabled to escape with a few personal belongings, but the entire stock of goods was lost. He sustained a painful, if not serious, burn on the hand. He estimates his loss at about \$6,000, less than half covered by insurance. John Brown of Gresham being the agent who will see that his insurance is promptly paid.

At the time of the fire Mr. Morgan was in a Portland hospital to undergo an operation on a broken leg and Mrs. Morgan at the home of relatives in Gresham. Both families lost everything in a similar fire three years ago, but had rebuilt. Now it is not known whether they will attempt to build again. Mr. Brown also states that \$400 insurance was paid Morgan on his house and contents.

The Waller poolhall was the place which was raided by a holdup man some months ago. Cecil Metzger was called to the scene of the fire and assisted in helping to save the garage of his brother, Walter Metzger, who was absent at Seaside. This place, the lumber yard and warehouse of John Valberg and the home of Mr. and Mrs. Morand were all near the blaze, but as there was no wind, they were saved by a timely effort.
