THE ANTI-DIMMING LAW.

What is it? Who has read it and knows its requirements? Most of us know it goes into effect September 1 and requires an inspection of headlights on every auto which will cost 75 cents and almost without exception will require the purchase of new bulbs of a specific candle power, new reflectors, etc., and in some cases new batteries and overhauling of entire light system, costing from \$5 to \$50 according to conditions.

Most of us know that certain garages in cities and towns throughout the state have been designated and authorized by the secretary of state and have equipped themselves to make the required inspection.

Most of us are getting the idea that the law is incomplete, is branded by some as a freak law, will be difficult to enforce, is unnecessary and is an over stepping of the police powers of the state. Already steps are being taken to get an injunction against its enforcement.

Attorneys Long and Ryan, of Portland, have joined to fight it through the courts. They will seek arrest for violation of the law in order to test it out.

Both Judge Ekwall and Police Chief Jenkins of Portland are quoted as not favoring the new law. Many regard it as unnecessary. At the same time it has some staunch champions.

The law is one more attempt to impose a regulation on the motorist which probably is not really necessary but means considerable expense for the car owner and a silver lining for the pockets of selected dealers as inspectors and equipment manufacturers and dealers.

It looks as though someone was a pretty shrewd salesman, coming into the state from outside and selling a proposition not needed in this state and putting it over by legislation.

Henry Ford has bought around 200 idle ships from the shipping board for the sum of \$1,704,000. This will be quite a relief to the government to get rid of these fast deteriorating vessels and may be Ford can make something out of them.

The president will call together the agricultural conference appointed by him a year ago and try to prepare some legislation for farm relief to be presented at the coming session of congress.

Bonds shall be dated October 1st, 1925, and shall bear interest at the rate of four and one-half per cent per annum, payable semi-annually. These bonds shall be issued in denominations of \$1,000.00 each; principal and interest to be paid in gold coin of the United States of America.
