PROPOSED PARKING ORDINANCE

The council of Gresham is laying itself liable to the criticism that is being made against the commissioners of Portland, and which other cities are sometimes subject to, that of introducing petty matters and passing up the more weighty and important.

The council is still at sea concerning a storage reservoir although faced with the absolute necessity of providing such a storage tank sufficient for a three days' maximum supply, with the final dictum of the city of Portland that the Bull Run water will be cut off a few days after December first if their requirement is not complied with.

The council is apparently still hoping to fall back on the possibility of augmenting its supply from the Helney springs, but this too will require a storage tank. This is undoubtedly very fine water. The plan has some advantages but it will take time, months perhaps, to determine the rights of the city and the practicability of the plan, and if it is decided to be feasible it will take time to lay the pipe to make it available.

A hearing will be held it is hoped in the near future to determine the rights of the city, if any.

In the meantime, the council finds time to propose an ordinance regulating street parking of autos and the recorder is instructed to present such an ordinance at the next regular council meeting next week. It is proposed to limit parking to two hours on certain streets and do away with several present irregularities and annoyances.

Perhaps it may be said of this that it should be done but certainly the other ought not to be left undone.
