**ORIENT**

The Orient grade school, district No. 6 joint, opened September 14 with an enrollment of 162 pupils. Several pupils have entered since the first day, bringing the enrollment up to about 115. Three new teachers are employed in the Orient school this year. F. D. Oleman, for the past two years principal of the Corbett grade school, is principal and teacher of the eighth grade. Miss Mabel Barnes teaches the sixth and seventh grades, Miss Dorothy Borth the fourth and fifth, Miss Vera McCabe is the teacher of the second and third grades and Mrs. Edith Mayer teaches the first. Special instruction is given in music, art and manual training for the upper grade boys.

A civics organization has been completed in the eighth grade class to promote a beautiful lawn, shrubs and flowers for the school. There is also a literary society that renders a program every two weeks and every one in the three upper grades takes a part, each member appearing on the program at least twice during the year. The Orient school building is one of the finest schools in the county east of Portland and was but recently completed at a cost of \$30,000. There are six class rooms and a large auditorium with an elaborate stage and scenery, also a moving picture curtain.

The Parent-Teacher association will meet in the schoolhouse on Friday evening, October 9, at which time matters of important business are to be considered including appointment of committees, discussion of the motion picture situation and election of delegates to the state convention which will meet in Portland the latter part of the month. A candy sale will also be conducted by the Camp Fire girls. A special school meeting of the Orient school board will meet on Thursday evening, October 15, to vote on the budget for the current year.

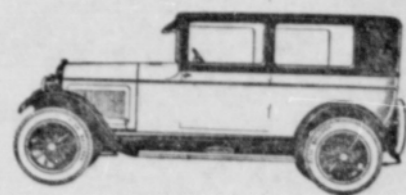
