OREGON'S DEBT INCREASES.

Oregon's funded debt is now nearly \$50 per capita.

According to figures compiled by the department of commerce Oregon's net indebtedness on September 30, 1924, was \$41,552,377, or \$49.94 per capita.

In 1917 it was \$9.66 per capita. This debt was incurred for agricultural purposes, state aid to war veterans, and highway construction.

High School Activities are Reported; Patron Support is Appreciated

The following interesting notes pertaining to high school and its various activities were kindly compiled by Principal Cannon and his assistant and will give a little idea of what is going on betimes at school:

The high school is grateful to those who have so willingly backed us by the purchase of a patron ticket. This ticket entitles one member of the family to attend any of our football, basketball or baseball games.

The school board is considering furnishing transportation free to students who attend our high school from outside the district. The new school law makes it possible for us to include the item of transportation in our list of items when computing the average cost per student.

We have experienced having some of our students taken to another school this year because the other school furnished free transportation to them while we have not been doing so.

The commercial department of the high school continues to grow and one additional typewriter will be added next Monday. This makes 21 machines in the commercial department.

The library facilities at the high school have not been what they should be and the board has set aside an amount sufficient to furnish books so that students may not be handicapped

by not being able to get the references they should have. Books on fiction, adventure, etc., will become the permanent property of the high school library and we shall not need to depend upon the central library to supply these books.

Last year's senior class turned \$258.33 into the student loan fund of the high school yesterday. All advertising has not been collected as yet and some funds remain in the senior class. These will be turned over as soon as the enlargement of the senior class picture has been paid for.

Dr. Adix will offer a silver cup to the best junior in the high school. The selection of the best junior is to be made by the faculty and in determining it citizenship, scholarship, student body activities and other qualifications will be considered.

Last Tuesday the second team of the high school defeated Park Rose on Stapleton field by the score of 21-8. Next Tuesday the second team plays West Linn on our grounds.

An election will take place to select student body council, finance committee and someone to succeed the late Judge G. W. Stapleton on the student loan fund board.
