WILLOS AND KELLY CONVICTED.

After 37 ballots, taken during 52 hours of deliberation, the jury of nine men and three women, that tried Jas. Willos and Ellsworth Kelley, came to an agreement and returned a verdict of guilt of murder in the first degree. They were associated with Tom Murray in the prison break of last August 12 in which John Sweeney, a guard, was shot and killed. The verdict carries the extreme penalty. Notice was given that the case will be appealed.

The period of deliberation, 52 hours, must be near the record time for a jury to be out. Too often a disagreement is reported in much less time. It would have been easy to have done so in this case. The jury is to be commended for the result.

The surprise to us in the trial of these desperate criminals was the nature of the pleas put up in their defense—insanity, self-defense, etc. If they had won their acquittal on these pleas what an encouragement it would have been to others criminally inclined.

Of course, every criminal is insane, of unsound mind, when he commits a crime. But he is responsible for planning and undertaking it. Everyone is insane when he does a rash deed that injures himself or another, but he must be accountable for the deliberate steps that lead him to do the act, else there is no restraint for the protection of life and society.

This all too prevalent insanity plea in extenuation of crime is pure "mush" and should not have any weight with sensible men and women no matter how eloquent or distinguished the lawyer who puts forth the plea for a stipend.

The cutworm outbreak of last season did immeasurable damage to truck and field crops all over Oregon. The department of entomology advises that growers may avoid a similar outbreak next season by late fall or early spring plowing and by scattering the poison bran bait over the fields before crops are planted in the spring.

NOTICE OF ELECTION. Notice is hereby given that at the general election to be held in the City of Gresham, Oregon, on the 24 day of November, 1925, there will be submitted to the legal voters of said City for their adoption or rejection the Charter amendments hereinafter set forth, to-wit:

RESOLUTION. Be It Resolved by the Common Council of the City of Gresham, Multnomah County, Oregon, that the following proposed amendments to the charter of said City be and the same hereby are proposed for submission to the legal voters of said City for their adoption or rejection at the regular city election to be held on the 24 day of November, 1925, as in this resolution provided:

CHARTER AMENDMENTS SUBMITTED TO THE VOTERS BY THE COUNCIL. An Act.

To amend an act entitled "An act to incorporate the Town of Gresham, in the County of Multnomah, Oregon, and to provide a charter therefor, and to repeal all acts or parts of acts in conflict therewith," filed in the office of the Secretary of State February 11, 1925, as subsequently amended by the legal voters of the Town of Gresham at the special election duly called and held therein on the 18th day of September, 1921, and as subsequently amended by the legal voters thereof at the special election duly called and held therein on the 23d day of August, 1921, and as subsequently amended by the legal voters of the Town of Gresham at the special election duly called and held therein on the 16th day of September, 1922, and as amended by all other amendments thereto enacted by the Legislative Assembly or by vote of the people.

special election duly called and held therein on the 27th day of May, 1921, and as subsequently amended by said legal voters at the special election duly called and held therein on the 23d day of August, 1921, and as subsequently amended at the special election duly called and held therein on the 16th day of September, 1922, and to amend all other amendments thereto enacted by the Legislative Assembly or by vote of the people.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF GRESHAM, that an act entitled "An act to incorporate the Town of Gresham, in the County of Multnomah, Oregon, and to provide a charter therefor, and to repeal all acts or parts of acts in conflict therewith" filed in the office of the Secretary of State February 11, 1925, as subsequently amended by the legal voters of the Town of Gresham at the special election duly called and held therein on the 18th day of September, 1921, and as subsequently amended by the legal voters thereof at the special election duly called and held therein on the 27th day of May, 1921, and as subsequently amended by said legal voters at the special election duly called and held therein on the 23d day of August, 1921, and as subsequently amended at the special election duly called and held therein on the 16th day of September, 1922, and as amended by all other amendments thereto enacted by the Legislative Assembly or by vote of the people be and the same hereby is amended by adding thereto Chapter 15 to read as follows:

CHAPTER 15. Section 1. For the purpose of providing funds with which to purchase a site and construct a reservoir for the storage of water, and to construct the necessary pipe lines connecting said reservoir with the city water system, the Common Council of the City of Gresham is hereby authorized and empowered to issue and dispose of general obligation bonds of said City in an amount not to exceed Thirty-three thousand dollars (\$33,000.00), said bonds to be in denominations of \$500 or \$1,000 each, to be signed by the Mayor and countersigned by the Recorder under the corporate seal of the City, having semi-annual interest coupons attached thereto bearing the facsimile engraved signature of the Mayor and Recorder, whereby the City shall be held in substance and effect to undertake and promise to pay the bearer of each said bond at maturity thereof the sum named therein in gold coin of the United States of the standard of value with interest thereon in like gold coin at the rate of not to exceed five and one-half per cent (5 1/2%) per annum, payable semi-annually, said bonds to be dated at a convenient time to be fixed by the Council, maturity or maturities to be likewise fixed by the Council, but not to exceed twenty (20) years from date, principal and interest of said bonds to be payable at the Fiscal Agency of the State of Oregon in New York City, which bonds shall be known as "City of Gresham Water Bonds, Series 1925."

Section 2. The bonds hereby authorized, before being sold, shall be advertised for sale by publication of notice of sale at least eight (8) days before the date of sale.

Section 3. The debt limitations contained in the charter of said City shall not apply to the bonds hereby authorized.

Section 4. The Common Council shall each year at the time of making the annual tax levy for city purposes include in such levy a sum sufficient to pay interest due on the outstanding bonds of this issue and to retire the principal thereof at maturity.

RESOLVED FURTHER that this resolution for proposed charter amendments submitted to the voters by the Council be filed with the Recorder of the City of Gresham for submission to the legal voters of said City for their rejection or approval to be voted upon at a regular election to be held as herein provided:

RESOLVED FURTHER that the Common Council deems it advisable and does hereby and hereby call and make necessary provision for the holding of the regular election which shall be and hereby is called to be held on the 23rd day of November, 1925, between the legal voting hours on said date, and that said time be and the same hereby is designated as the time for holding said regular election, and the City Hall in said City is hereby designated as the polling place therefor and

the following named persons are hereby designated and appointed as and for the judges and clerks of said election, to-wit: F. C. Jones, B. W. Emery and John Sieret, judges; Neil J. Thorne and Annie Hevel, Clerks.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Recorder be and he is hereby instructed to publish the hereinabove proposed charter amendments submitted to the voters in the manner provided by law, that is to say, by publication of this resolution in full with the ballot title therefor once or oftener within the twenty-one (21) days immediately preceding said regular election in the Gresham Outlook, the official newspaper of said City, and hereby designated for said purpose.

CHARTER AMENDMENTS SUBMITTED TO THE VOTERS BY THE COUNCIL. An Act.

To amend the charter of the City of Gresham, Oregon, by adding thereto Chapter 15, authorizing the issuance and sale of \$33,000.00 bonds of said City to provide funds with which to purchase a site and construct a reservoir for the storage of water, and provide pipe for connecting said reservoir with the water system of the City, and providing for the levy of a special tax to pay principal of and interest on said bonds.

An Act of the City of Gresham by annexing to the Corporate Limits of the City of Gresham, Oregon, the following described tracts or parcels of real property, to-wit:

All that portion of CLEVELAND ADDITION, North of the present City Limits including lots nine (9) to Twenty-six (26) inclusive in Block "A" and Lots Eleven (11) to Thirty-one (31) inclusive in Block "B."

Shall the corporate limits of the City of Gresham, Oregon, be so changed as to include the above described tracts or parcels of real property within the corporate limits thereof by annexation?

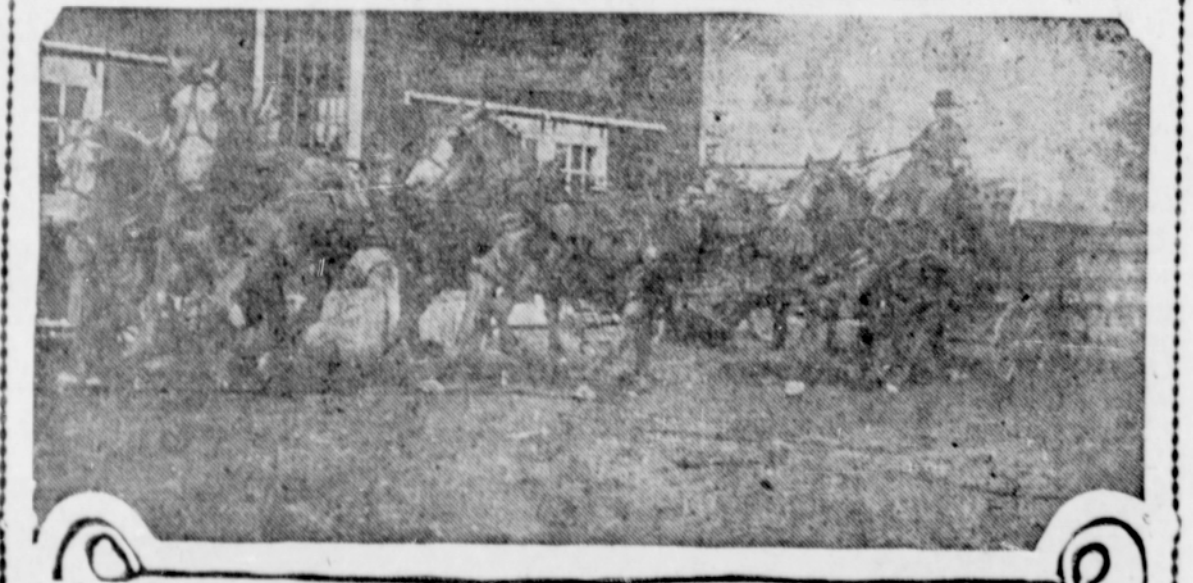

THE Pacific International Livestock Exposition opens Saturday, October 31st, running until and including Saturday, November 7th. The building covering over ten acres of ground under one roof is the annual gathering place of livestock which constitutes the greatest affair of its kind in the world, all of the best in the West competing against the champions of Eastern shows that come to the Coast by a special train made up of freight, express and Pullman cars for whose swift passage even the fastest passenger trains are side-tracked. The Horse Show which is held in connection with the Exposition is in itself of international importance and its record offering of \$28,000 in prize money attracts the best horse from all portions of the continent, more than a dozen carloads coming from east of the Missouri River. There are 85 events on the 1925 program, of which 13 are stakes averaging in value \$1500 each, which have been subscribed by enterprising business men and institutions of Portland and Seattle. A. P. Fleming, who has managed the horse show since its first year in 1919, has been the great factor in its upbuilding and is considered to deserve more credit than any other one person for the remarkable comeback of the horse show game on the Pacific Coast.
