**THE OPERATIONS ARE AS FOLLOWS:**

**WHEELS—**

Jack up car; remove rims and wheels. Clean, inspect and repack wheel bearings. Replace wheels and adjust. Inspect rim lugs, rims, and replace. Align front wheels.

**ELECTRICAL—**

Tighten, clean and adjust breaker points. Inspect generator brushes (renew if necessary). Clean commutator. Inspect starting and ignition switches. Inspect all wiring and tighten all connections. Test and water battery and vaseline terminals.

**BODY AND FENDERS—**

Tighten all body bolts. Tighten fender brackets to frame. Tighten fender bolts. Tighten windshield top brackets. Tighten floor boards. Tighten engine pans.

**MOTOR—**

Clean carbon and grind valves. Adjust valve tappets. Clean spark plugs. Tighten motor support bolts. Tighten all motor and transmission bolts. Tighten generator chain. Clean out gas lines and strainers. Clean out vacuum tank.

**BRAKES—**

Adjust and equalize foot and hand brakes.

**SPRINGS—**

Tighten spring shackles. Tighten spring clamps to axle. Tighten spring clips to axle. Tighten springs rebound clamps and bolts. Reoil spring saddles.

**OIL AND GREASE— ENTIRE CAR—**

Drain crank case. Clean oil strainer. Refill crankcase to proper level with new oil. Wash out transmission and fill to proper level. Repack universal joint. Repack propeller shaft bearings. Wash out and fill differential to proper level. Repack steering gear. Grease spring bolts, steering knuckle and tie rod bolts. Grease reach rod connections at both ends. Grease fan and water pump bushings and distributor shaft. Oil rear generator bearing. Oil horn armature. Grease clutch release bearing and inspect flexible grease tube. Oil brake cams and brake connections. Oil clutch pedal shaft connections. Oil spring leaves with penetrating oil. Oil all door locks, hinges, and hood clamps.

**COOLING SYSTEM—**

Install new hoses if needed. Tighten all hose connections, tighten water pump gland nuts (repack if necessary). Tighten radiator frame. Tighten radiator core to shell. Take up end play in fan and adjust fan belt.

**STEERING—**

Thoroughly examine and tighten up steering connections. Adjust steering gear. Tighten steering column to dash and toe board.

**CLEANING—**

Remove grease and dirt from motor with oil spray.
