MRS. F. N. WIRT DIES FROM PARALYTIC STROKE

Mrs. Josephine Wirt, wife of Fred N. Wirt, proprietor of the Powell Valley nursery west of Gresham, passed away Sunday, December 6, at the age of 64 years. Three years ago she suffered a stroke of paralysis and a second stroke a year ago left her in a helpless condition and at times scarcely able to talk.

Mrs. Wirt was a native of Virginia, where she has a brother and a half sister. She was a member of the Christian church. Eighteen years ago she was married to Mr. Wirt, who survives her. Besides her husband she leaves two daughters by a former marriage, Mrs. J. E. Anderson of Portland and Mrs. Nora Marsh of Seattle, besides four grandchildren.

Funeral services were conducted Tuesday afternoon at the J. E. Metzger funeral chapel by Dr. C. W. Huett. Interment was in the Mt. Scott cemetery.

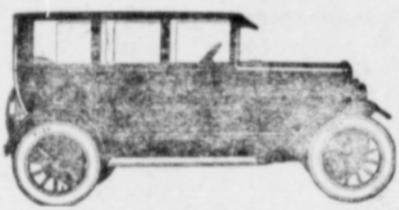
