ELTON WATKINS TALKS TO GRESHAM AUDIENCE

The Honorable Elton Watkins, ex-United States congressman, spoke yesterday afternoon at the public library to a good-sized and appreciative audience which interrupted him frequently with applause as he handled the narcotic question without gloves. He traded verbally those parents who spent their time at the lodge and card parties evenings and left their children to roam the streets until picked up by an officer and either escorted home or to the city jail. He declared the father and mother, and not the child, should be placed in confinement.

He declared that criminals are not going to Sunday school. He eulogized the Bible as the greatest piece of literature in the world.

Mr. Watkins gave some vivid word pictures of the narcotic or dope fiend. He said that more pitiful than a person without a mind is the person who has a mind but whose will is gone, the condition of the dope addict. He spoke at length of the alien who can be deported if he fails to abide by the laws of the country, but the American citizen who continually violates the laws of the land cannot be deported.

He deplored the fact that officials in high standing are drinking and trafficking in liquor and dope.

In speaking of the workings of the Harrison narcotic law, Mr. Watkins stated that men are needed who not only believe in the letter of the law, but who worship the spirit of the law. He declared that narcotics are even worse than liquor. A person will steal, lie, perjure or commit murder to obtain the dope that he craves.

He described the workings of the world's court which is an outcome of the league of nations and which he declared himself to be in hearty sympathy with. Mr. Watkins closed his interesting address by exhorting the women of the W. C. T. U. to put on a vigorous campaign for new members, to aggressive militarism and to band and stand together until victory is assured along the line of law enforcement. He said that a bill has now gone in to congress to abolish the workings of the Volstead act.
