**Holding Up Oleo Law.**

The last Wisconsin legislature passed a law forbidding the use of dairy products in the manufacture of oleomargarine, practically the same as the initiative bill submitted in Oregon. A Chicago oleomargarine company has held up the law on constitutional grounds and it will now take its course through the courts, doubtless going to the U. S. supreme court for final decision. Similar proposed legislation in other states will now wait the outcome of this test.

**Methodist Episcopal Church.**

The regular services will be held at the Methodist Episcopal church next Sunday, beginning with Bible school at 10 o'clock. The morning worship and sermon will be at 11 o'clock, when the pastor, Dr. C. W. Huett, will take for his topic "Advices for Christmas." Robt. Callister, who three years ago had resided for a year with his nephew and wife, Mr. and Mrs. Ernest Callister, two and a half miles east of Gresham near Palmbad station, died Saturday, December 12, at Butte, Montana, where he had gone after leaving Gresham. He was injured in the copper mines in Montana five or six years ago and had been ailing since, this injury no doubt contributing to his death. He was making preparations to return to Gresham, expecting to have been here last month, when his relatives received the message announcing his death. Ernest Callister left the same evening for Montana where he superintended the funeral and burial arrangements of his uncle, who was about 58 years of age. Besides the Gresham relative, Mr. Callister is survived by an uncle in Illinois. He had never married. The Elks lodge No. 240 of Butte, of which he was a member, had charge of the funeral which was held in that city Tuesday. Mr. Callister returned home this morning.

the boys and girls, teaching them the methods of growing a perfect cow or calf, but have not devoted any of the time to developing a blue ribbon boy or girl. They are hoping this project will take hold of that particular phase of the work and create a great deal of enthusiasm.

The demonstration was a great success. The parents of the Russellville community were present to observe, and Miss Case, nutrition specialist, introduced the subject and told why such a project was very essential. She gave many lantern slides to illustrate her points.

Dr. C. Ulysses Moore, of Portland, one of the foremost child doctors in the country, gave a practical demonstration of the boys and girls themselves, pointing out the defects and the perfect points, scoring eight boys and girls in this manner. W. D. Kinder, county club agent, closed the meeting, by securing local leaders and

parents to organize the health clubs soon.

This is a new project and it is thought only two or three schools will be selected to participate in the project, as the enrollment for the year 1926 is limited to 100 members.

Miss Mary P. Billmeyer, county health nurse, and her assistant, Mrs. Paul Whiteside, are cooperating very heartily with the organizers of the project. They are assisting with the demonstrations and checking up on the individuals from time to time. It is planned to hold demonstrations every three months in order to check up on the boys and girls as to the most suitable food for them.
