Auto Suggestions

Gathered from reliable sources to help you get the most service out of that car of yours.

When the North Wind Blows.

"We used to 'jack 'em up' for the winter in my day, says Grandpa.

But in these winter days of bobbed skirts, low necks and gauze stockings the motor car is just as sturdy, if not more so, than our women. And so "jacking up a motor car for the winter" isn't done. It doesn't need to be.

But just the same the same precautions should be taken with an automobile as with a human. Both must be protected against the elements.

The "can't start" trouble in cold weather is due to improper carburetion. Because low temperatures hinder evaporation of gasoline it is necessary that the carburetor be adjusted for a cold weather mixture.

A fully charged battery never freezes. Make positive that yours is fully charged before the first cold snap. Then you will have nothing to worry about.

Frozen radiators are the bugaboo of winter driving. And yet there is no reason for this because there are various anti-freezing mixtures for sale in the accessory stores. As an additional protection a radiator cover is a good investment.

Skid chains, though hard on tires, are an absolute necessity when street and road is snow or ice covered. Since the rear tires receive the most wear, it is often advisable to switch the rear tires to the front before winter sets in. And bear in mind that proper inflation during the winter months is even more important than in summer.

Because of the more frequent use of the choke in winter and the resultant greater dilution in the oil, the crank case should be drained more often in winter than in summer. And because cold oil is too heavy to circulate properly, running the motor on cold mornings to warm it up is liable to result in serious damage. But then one should never race the motor.

These things and an intelligent caring for of the car through the winter will result in longer life, more dependable service, and greatly reduced repair bills.
