GOOD FRIDAY.

Why "Good Friday"? Did not the high crime of all the ages occur on this day about 1900 years ago? Was not the best man that ever walked and taught among men, who not only was without sin himself but came to save others from sin, on this day ignominiously put to death by crucifixion between two malefactors?

It is not the fact of his death or the outward manner of it that makes this Good Friday. It is the consequences, the after-effects, the then hidden but since revealed purpose of it that has brought life and immortality to light through the gospel that makes it Good Friday.

It is not because of any far-sighted, beneficent purpose of his enemies who demanded his death, or of the laxity of the Roman government that permitted and executed the crucifixion of "that just one" that the race has benefited from that death.

There was a divine and unsearchable purpose through it all that is perhaps only partly realized today. If Good Friday had not been followed by Easter Sunday it could not have been considered as it is.

If any one of us had been present in Jerusalem, as Jew or Gentile, at the time would we have been one of his disciples? or among those who cried, "Away with him, crucify him?"

We had best humble ourselves. And if we do so in the right spirit on Easter day we can say with rejoicing, "We are risen with Christ."
