MAIL ORDER INSURANCE.

Oregon has a good law relating to insurance companies doing business in this state. Its main object is to protect the policy holders.

Insurance Commissioner Will Moore advises that a certain life insurance company of Kansas is circulating the state soliciting accident insurance.

There are two primary causes for mail order insurance: First, to escape the payment of taxes; and second, to avoid the restrictions placed upon licensed companies for the protection of the policyholders.

Should a claim against one of these policies be contested, the policy-holder would be forced to go to the courts of Kansas for recourse, as the courts of Oregon would be closed to him.

In purchasing insurance of any kind it is advisable to patronize only those companies which are licensed to do business in this state, as these companies are under the supervision of the insurance department and are amenable to all of the laws of the state of Oregon.

This is American Forest week. It is set aside as such to call the attention of the people to the value of our fast diminishing forest areas and to emphasize the need of greater care to prevent forest fires and wastefulness. It is a timely lesson. It is all the more important this year because of the earlier season and unusually dry spring.

Crops Reported Good. The present high condition of winter wheat with practically no winter-killing of the acreage seeded last fall indicates the probability of a very excellent wheat crop for the Oregon 1926 harvest, says F. L. Kent, statistician, United States department of agriculture.

March weather was very favorable to the growth of all fall seeded crops and pasture, as well as permitting considerable spring seeding. March rainfall was less than 20 per cent of the normal precipitation for the month.
