STEIWER SHOULD WIN.

There are eight candidates for the United States senate on the republican ballot—only eight. That's about five or six too many but there are that many who would like to get the nomination although only one can be nominated.

It is reasonably sure one of the four ablest and best known men will get the nomination. These are, Steiwer, Stanfield, Clark and Crossley. Reports seem to indicate they are running in about that order. Of the other four none can hope to win but they will get some votes and their names on the ballot will only help to scatter the vote and make the result uncertain.

Under the circumstances, it is all the more important that republican voters concentrate on a candidate who is most likely to win, in other words a candidate who would in all respects make a worthy and efficient representative of this great state, whose policies are clearly defined and acceptable, and who could be safely continued for several terms. That man is Steiwer.

Judge Lawrence T. Harris, of Eugene, says in reference to Steiwer for senator:

"If he is nominated by the members of the republican party, he can easily be elected next November. I predict that if Frederick Steiwer is seated in the United States senate he will before the end of his first term become recognized throughout the nation as one of the leaders of that body and that through him Oregon will reap much credit and honor."
