DUMP PIT MAY BE CLOSED.

County Road Master Buck has registered a vigorous complaint about the misuse of the pit on the Section Line west of Gresham set aside as a dumping ground for Gresham and vicinity.

He says that the gates have been broken down, and the entrance and driveway so blocked it is nearly impossible to get into the pit itself.

That isn't the worst feature, according to Mr. Buck, who recently made an inspection and listened to complaints of nearby residents. The pit was intended only for rubbish but vegetable and animal offal is being dumped at the place.

The disgust of the county authorities when they learned of the abuse of the privilege was intense. It may lead to the closing of the pit. Mr. Buck said he would have the gates fixed, but in use a scraper to draw the loads of rubbish dumped near the entrance into the pit, and likely keep the place under lock and key.

This is an instance where thoughtless persons destroy the proper and much needed use of a dumping pit.

It has been urged that if the pit is locked up a key be put in the hands of the city marshal.

200-ACRE LYNCH FARM MAY BECOME AIR PORT

It is possible that the 200-acre ranch belonging to H. W. Lynch four miles west of Gresham on the Section Line road may yet be used as an air port site if the city of Portland decides on purchasing a suitable location as an aviation field.

Eight or nine sites have been recommended to the council, but so far but two places, the Lynch farm, and a 160-acre piece lying between Derby street and Union avenue approaches to the Interstate bridge, seem to be regarded as at all suitable locations.
