**THE VOTERS' PAMPHLET.**

Eighty thousand of the voters' pamphlets, so called, or statements of republican candidates, have been printed by the secretary of state and mailed to registered republican voters in Multnomah county. The use of it by candidates is purely voluntary and is so much per. Not all have placed their pictures and statements therein.

It is doubted if one in ten of the voters will read it carefully enough to make it pay, but it may influence some voters. It should be accepted and used for the purpose for which it was intended, namely to inform the voters regarding the candidates. Most of the statements are by the candidates themselves or by their secretaries and therefore should be taken with a "grain of salt."

Of the 46 names on the ballot for state representative only 34 used the pamphlet.

Three legislative candidates are women and of the three two are lawyers. Their statements seem to indicate they are of average intelligence with their fellow lawyer candidates.

What a popular thing it must be to run for the state legislature. There being so many candidates it becomes more than usual an important task for the voter to become informed as well as possible and select the best and safest for the job.

**GRANGE HITS 'EM HARD.**

M. M. Burtner, member of State Grange legislature committee, writing in the Oregon Grange Bulletin hits 'em hard when he appeals to the grangers to vote and get others to vote and vote right. He says:

"There is but one candidate for governor, worthy of your consideration, in the two major political parties. Both are tried and true grangers. The others are either 'wet' or have been. One of them voted for the Dennis resolution, which is the best evidence that he does not favor an income tax.

"Fight the old political convention movement in the state, or the farmer's name too will be 'Dennis' in future elections. Vote against your grandmother, if she is for the old boss ridden system of making nominations.

"See that every granger goes to the primary and takes his wife along. If he hasn't one, take some other man's wife, in other words, take a car load with you. See that they vote right, or let them walk home."

**Dunne Should Have Grange Vote.**

The Fourteenth senatorial district, composed of Columbia, Clackamas and Multnomah counties, has two candidates for the republican nomination for state senator. One is K. K. Kubli, who boasts that he has all the big corporations with him and who was against the farmers in the oleo and filled milk fights. The other candidate is Joe Dunne, who stood with the Grange in its fight for the dairymen. This ought to be all the information members of the Grange who live in this district need.—Oregon Grange Bulletin.

**Memorial to Founders.**

A significant event scheduled to take place in the city of Washington in June will be the dedication of a memorial to the seven men who were the founders, nearly 60 years ago, of the organization known as the Patrons of Husbandry, more commonly called the grange. Prominent grange members and farm and rural leaders from all parts of the country will be attracted to Washington for this June event, to pay tribute to the organization which has contributed so largely to farm progress and rural contentment in the United States.

None of the seven grange founders are living, but two of their immediate associates still survive and continue active in grange affairs.

**GRANGE STANDS FOR PROHIBITION**

In the recent clash of the "wets and dries" in the prohibition hearings conducted by congress, no organization figured more conspicuously than the National Grange and no other put itself more vigorously on record for a strict enforcement of the 18th Amendment. The attitude of the grange was concisely stated in this declaration publicly made at the congressional hearing:—

The National Grange recognizes the clear right of a majority of the people at any time to amend or to abolish the Constitution, provided only that it is done in an orderly and legal way and according to the orderly methods in which they themselves have acquiesced and by which they are legally bound. Unless and until such a change is made in the Constitution of the United States the National Grange, as a body of more than a million substantial moral, sober, law-abiding, farm people, will oppose with every power at its command, individually and as an organization, nationally and in the states, any change in the law which

violates the clearly expressed principles of the 18th Amendment.
