The ordinance which was recently passed by the Portland city council intended to prevent the "endless chain" system of merchandising has been declared unenforceable and a decision has now been handed down by Circuit Judge Evans upholding the contention of the Unique Hosiery company that it be allowed to operate within the city limits of Portland.

LAST RITES SAID OVER REMAINS OF JOHN BROWN

Sympathizing friends and neighbors filled the Methodist Episcopal church Friday afternoon to pay their last marks of respect to the memory of John Brown who died Wednesday morning, June 2, at Good Samaritan hospital from paralysis following an operation. Business houses throughout the town closed during the afternoon in honor of the occasion and nearly every prominent business man in Gresham was present at the funeral.

John Brown was born at Molesworth, Ontario, Canada, May 19, 1867. At the age of 19 he moved to Oregon with his parents and settled near Lexington. While spending two years at Medical Lake and Spokane, Washington, he learned the carpenter's trade. He then moved to Rockwood, Oregon, and on September 26, 1894, was married to Miss Minnie A. Smith, of Portland.

Mr. Brown followed the carpenter and contracting business for several years and was engaged in the mercantile business at Rockwood for seven years and while thus engaged was largely instrumental in organizing the Rockwood school district and the Macabee and Odd Fellow lodges.

During all the years of Mr. Brown's business career he never became hard hearted or indifferent to the feelings and needs of others. He was generous almost to a fault. He never complained about his own troubles and sufferings. He loaned and gave away money to friends and strangers, often without making any record of what he had done.

A. E. Hill, editor of the "Montavilla Times," paid a beautiful tribute to Mr. Brown through the columns of his paper, in the following words: "The editor of the Montavilla Times numbered John as one of his close personal friends and it is with deep sorrow that we chronicle his taking away. In our associations with him in a social way during our stay of the greater part of four years in Gresham we had learned to regard Mr. Brown as a lover of his fellowmen. A big, generous-hearted fellow, he would neglect his own business to assist someone else. John will be missed by a host of friends, as he has been a prominent citizen of Multnomah county

since an early day. It was an untimely ending of a worthwhile career, as he was only 59 years of age." The commitment services were held at Douglas cemetery, the beautiful ritualistic service of Villa lodge, I. O. O. F., of which he was a member, being exemplified by a group of fellow lodge members. Funeral arrangements were in the care of the Gresham Funeral parlors.

How to make Strawberry Jam keep the color and flavor of the fresh berries
