FLAG DAY.

June 14 is now universally recognized as Flag day. Just 32 years ago it was first officially acknowledged as such, the governor of New York ordering the Stars and Stripes to be raised on all public buildings in the state on that day.

The history of the flag is an interesting one. After Washington had taken command of the Revolutionary army at Cambridge in 1776, he unfolded before them a flag of 13 stripes of alternate red and white, having upon one of its corners the red and white crosses of St. George and St. Andrew on a field of blue.

But on the 14th of June, 1777, it was resolved by congress, "That the flag of the 13 United States be 13 stripes, alternate red and white, and that the union be 13 white stars in a blue field."

Many stories are in existence concerning the making of the first flag, but it has been decided that the honor of giving the rippling banner its most familiar name belongs to William Driver, a Salem, Massachusetts sailor.

"The flag of the United States symbolizes that freedom, equality, justice and humanity for which our forefathers sacrificed their lives and personal fortunes. Today this flag represents a nation of over one hundred million free people, its constitution and institutions, its achievements and aspirations."
