SANTIAM FOREST MAP FREE ON REQUEST

Copies of a new map of the Santiam national forest located in north central Oregon west of the Cascade summit, have just been received at the offices of district forester Granger in Portland and the forest supervisor in Albany.

This map is in the form of a compact pocket folder and shows the location of cities, towns, roads, horse trails, rivers, lakes, mountain peaks and other interesting natural features within and surrounding the forest. The Santiam forest extends along the west slope of the Cascade range from the Clackamas-Santiam divide on the north to the McKenzie river on the south.

On the back of the map useful in-

formation is furnished concerning the principal resources of the region, in the shape of timber, water power, forage and recreation. Timber, estimated at twelve billion board feet, is the main economic resource, but many interesting scenic features are also described, together with directions for reaching them.

Among the attractive places thus described are Mount Jefferson, over 10,500 foot altitude; Three Fingers Jack, Clear Lake, said to have the purest and coldest water of any lake in the Cascade mountains; Marion Lake, Nine Lakes Basin, Breitenbush Hot Springs, 12 miles from Detroit; and Upper Soda Springs, 11 miles above Cascadia.

The folder also outlines the forest fire control organization, and carries valuable health hints and suggestions for the guidance of sportsmen and other visitors in the proper use of the forest, particularly in safe-guarding the woods against fire.

These maps are free. Single copies may be obtained from the forest supervisor at Albany, Oregon, or from the district forester at Portland.

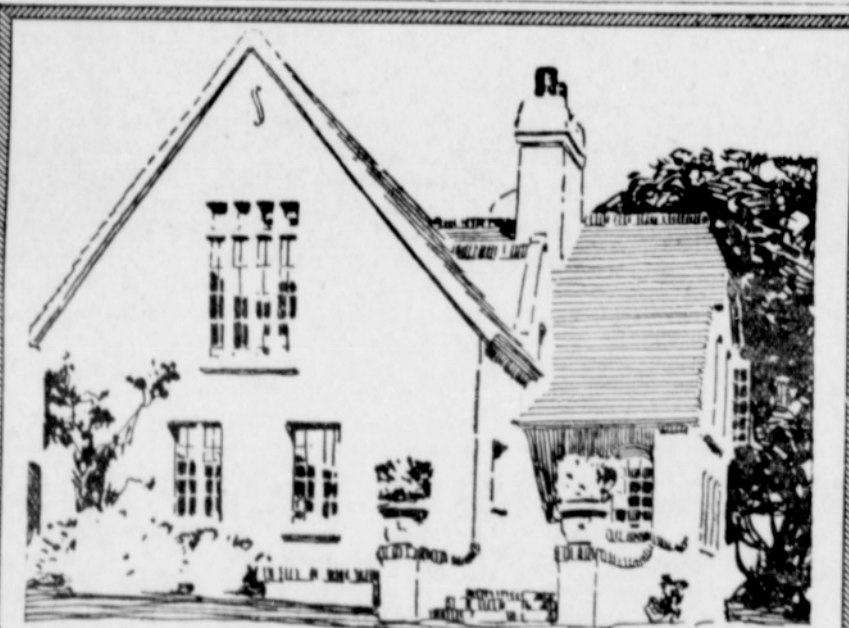
