HONORING THE FOUNDERS.

Astoria will celebrate its founders' day on July 20, 21 and 22. It is the oldest white settlement on the Pacific coast and may well honor the great names with which its beginning is associated.

Among the names that have entered into the early history of Astoria and of Oregon are Captain Gray, Merriwether Lewis and William Clark, and John Jacob Astor.

Captain Gray, in 1792, brought his ship Columbia over the surf beaten bar and anchored close to where Astoria now stands. He named the mighty river he discovered after his ship.

Lewis and Clark reached the goal of their intrepid journey overland and spent the winter of 1807 where Astoria now stands.

Astoria was named after its founder John Jacob Astor who backed a trading expedition which entered the Columbia in May 1811.

Later while British forces occupied this territory and while mistaken and poorly formed politicians of our own nation were trying to separate this territory from the United States, it was the fact of these heroic achievements, of discovery, exploration and settlement, that gave final determination to the boundary problem bringing what later became the great states of Idaho, Washington, Oregon and Montana into the Union.

The daring feats of those hardy pioneers of another century are to be fittingly commemorated.

Vincent Astor, great, great grandson of John Jacob Astor has erected on Astoria heights a magnificent column, the only one of its kind in America, from the apex of which may be seen four snow-capped mountains, ships on the Pacific ocean and a vast panorama of rivers, forests and inland country. The dedication of this column will be the central event of the historical celebration.

Even the convicts at the state pen now take a short vacation trip—some of them.

The four escaped convicts from the state penitentiary enjoyed only a few days' liberty and are now back in their cells. Fortunately there was no shooting.
