A QUESTIONABLE SPORT.
Gene Tunney in a ten-round slugging match in Philadelphia last night won from Jack Dempsey the world heavy-weight championship as a pugilist. Dempsey won the title from Jess Willard July 4, 1919, and has been called on to defend it four or five times.

The fight was staged on the grounds of the Sesqui-Centennial exposition at an immense open-air stadium and was witnessed by 132,000 people. The gate receipts amounted to nearly two million dollars, of which Dempsey received about \$600,000 and the new champion about \$200,000.

If looks count in contests whose main feature is brute force then Tunney won his popularity and success partly on that account. He is a young man of good education and no bad habits (it is said), unless it be a propensity to fight, which he may have learned in his boyhood. He is unmarried. But he will surely have a lot of proposals now. Although he is too fine appearing a young American citizen to be a champion prize fighter. He will be idolized and that will more than likely mean that he will be spoiled for any other purpose than his "chosen profession," so to speak.

His profession and position are not such as should merit the aspirations or efforts of our boys to strive for. And in this statement we do not mean to belittle amateur sports, including boxing and wrestling, not at all. We would encourage them, just as we would football, basket ball and baseball, tennis, golf and others.

Perhaps ten million people listened to the sordid details of the fight, round by round, blow by blow, and while this was a marvelous achievement no one can claim that the experience is particularly elevating.

Notice of School Election to Increase Tax More Than Six Per Cent Over That of the Previous Year.

Notice is hereby given to the legal voters of Union High School District No. 2 of Multnomah County, State of Oregon, that an election will be held in said District at High School Building on the 14th day of October, 1926, at 8 o'clock in the afternoon, to vote on the question of increasing the amount of the tax levy in said District for the years 1926, 1927 and 1928, by more than six per cent over the amount of such levy for the year immediately preceding.

It is necessary to raise this additional amount by special levy for the following reasons:
The Tax Supervising and Conservation Commission have determined that our General Tax Levy for the year 1926 will be \$16,613.99 including the 6 per cent increase which we are allowed by law.

Therefore, to provide sufficient funds to carry on the high school in its present high standard and to conduct same within the strict interpretation of the law it will be necessary that the taxpayers authorize a special tax of \$26,500.00 for the school year 1926-1927 to appear on the assessment roll of 1926 and be collected in the year 1927, also a special tax of \$26,600.00 for the school year 1927-1928 to appear on the assessment roll of 1927 and be collected in the year 1928, also a special tax for the school year 1928-1929 to appear on the assessment roll of 1928 and to be collected in the year 1929.
