SAYS HE KNOWS. BUT DOES HE?

The other night we read in the Portland News what its editor, Fred L. Boalt, said about Almee's "acting." Last night we read an editorial in the aforesaid News which convinces us that Fred would qualify well in the same category.

From the way Fred writes about the country editors we take it that he was one—some time ago—and his description and characterization are based on his recollections, now somewhat hazy, of his early day experiences.

Fred apparently doesn't know that the editor and publisher of the country or smaller town weekly of today is very different from the one of 40 or 50 years ago, or even 20 or 30 years ago.

"The rural subscriber leaves with the editor a peck of wormy apples, a sad cabbage, or a dozen passe eggs, and considers he is entitled to the paper for another year. He seldom reads it, but the wife uses it to line the pantry shelves."

"Once in a while the country editor gets a two-inch advertisement in return for a two-column editorial boosting some political candidate, and maybe he gets a chance to print some political handbills, too. At such times he eats."

"The kind of country editor I am describing—the kind that runs most of the newspapers in the Oregonian's list of Steiwer supporters—never had guts enough to dictate to anybody."
