THE CONVENTION.

Gresham has made history this week. It has been one of the busiest and best in the city's 21 years of incorporated life.

All the former large banquets, some of them taxing the capacity of the spacious Masonic hall, were planned and arranged by the men of the commercial club, assisted by their wives.

The occasion for all this activity and entertainment was the convention of the State Woman's Christian Temperance Union, whose sessions have occupied the days and evenings of the week since Tuesday.

Many favorable comments have been made by delegates on the heartiness of the reception they have received and the pleasant arrangements for the holding of the convention, for all of which the local workers and friends are duly grateful.

It may truly be said Gresham has been honored and benefitted by the presence of the 200 or so delegates and the convention has been an uplift to the people of the locality.

GUILTY IN THE PUBLIC'S MIND.

Why the jury in the Daugherty-Miller case disagreed may never be revealed to the public.

But the public will never be satisfied with the outcome. The jury sensed that a crime had been committed. This seemed pretty clear. However, the lengthy wranglings in the jury room and the repeated appeals to the court for explanations showed that a minority of the jurors could not tie up in their minds the wrong doing with the intricacies of the indictment.

Harry M. Daugherty and Thomas W. Miller may consider themselves lucky that the jurors didn't comprehend all the ramifications of the law.

The story uncovered in the trial was distressing. The evidence for the most part was deadly, uncontradicted. District Attorney Buckner presented his case with damning facts. However, the defendants escaped a verdict of guilty chiefly through the fact that they could not be tried directly for bribery but had to be tried under a conspiracy statute which raises much greater legal difficulties.

Technically, Daugherty and Miller are not guilty. But they stand convicted before the bar of public opinion, no matter what a few jurymen may have decided. Nor will the public ever forget this humiliating chapter in the history of federal administration, nor should it lose any time in demanding a new and decisive trial.
