ANTI-SALOON LEAGUE OPPOSES STANFIELD.

The Anti-Saloon League of Oregon has again expressed its opposition to the candidacy of Robert N. Stanfield for United States senator, according to a statement just issued from its office in the Worcester building, Portland, by its campaign committee, E. A. Baker, A. L. Veazie and J. P. Newell.

In the same statement it says that it has no reason to believe that it made a mistake in endorsing Frederick Steiwer, republican, for the same office in the primary election, and that the League did not take issue between the democratic aspirants in the primaries, as both candidates qualified to the satisfaction of the organization.

"The League is non-political and non-partisan, therefore it does not now discriminate between Mr. Steiwer and Mr. Haney, the republican and democratic candidates, respectively.

"The League is however, unalterably opposed to the election of Robert N. Stanfield, the independent candidate. The League therefore calls on all citizens of Oregon who believe in the principle of prohibition and the observance and enforcement of law, to vote against the candidacy of Robert N. Stanfield for the office of United States senator at the coming November election."

A. A. Smith, of Baker, a former member of the Oregon legislature and now serving on the state tax investigating committee, will broadcast a speech over KGW at Portland on Saturday, October 30, from 8 to 8:15 p. m.

Mr. Smith, who is a recognized authority on matters pertaining to taxation, will discuss the proposed constitutional amendment submitted by the Housewives' Council of Portland, and which has for its purpose the entrance of the state of Oregon into the light and power business. Radio fans may expect to hear a brief but interesting talk on this proposed legislation.

That at said election the following officers for said City will be elected to fill the respective positions for the term of two (2) years, beginning January 1, 1927:

- One (1) Mayor. One (1) Treasurer. One (1) Recorder. Three (3) Councilmen.

That at said election the following measures will be voted upon:

Authorizing the Council of the City of Gresham to levy an additional tax over and above the six per cent. limitation of not to exceed Two Thousand Five Hundred (\$2,500.00) Dollars per year for not more than ten (10) years and to thereby continue in force the special levy authorized by the special act of the year 1923 for the general expense of the City of Gresham. This will not increase the tax rate of the City of Gresham, but is a continuation of a special levy previously authorized.

Also, An Act, initiated by petition to amend Chapter 2, Section 2 of the Charter of the City of Gresham, to provide that the Marshal of the City of Gresham shall be appointed or removed by a majority vote of the Council, and not elected as by said Charter now provided.

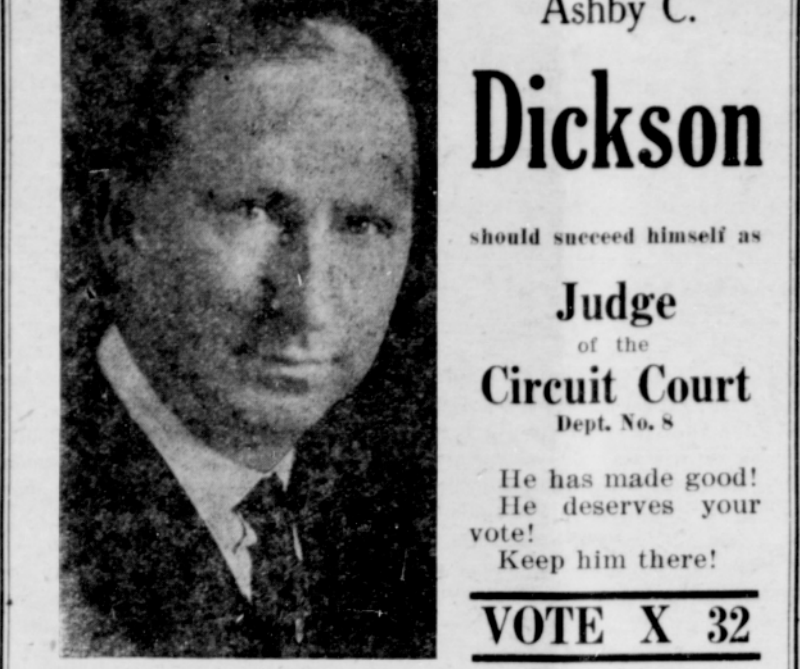
