Governor Pierce has pardoned Allan McLaren, convicted in the circuit court of Clackamas county for criminal assault and sentenced to three years in the penitentiary. He had served about a year. This action seems to be the opposite of the governor's declared policy in regard to executive pardons but it is thought he must have felt that he had good grounds for his action as he is known to be conscientious about such matters. Generally regret is expressed on the ground that leniency tends to minimize the heinousness of the crime.

WHY DO OLD MEN WORK?

Why do old people keep right on working, with rare exceptions, even after the necessity of earlier years is past? Why don't they take the years beyond 50 or 60 for rest, travel, reading or play? After a man is 50 he should not have anything on his mind but hair, says someone. But at that age many men haven't even that on their minds unless it is in an effort to retrieve the loss suffered through worry.

The reasons for a continued devotion to life's activities are mainly twofold, where the absolute necessity has ceased. They are habit and pleasure. Most elderly people who are in good health have become so accustomed to toil of some useful kind that they are quite lost without it. The mind and the muscles seem to demand the accustomed activity.

The other reason is it is pleasurable. There is joy in service for those who have lived, and are living, with some worthy and cherished object in life. It is a way of doing good and earning money with which to aid some worthy cause. And rest is always sweeter when it follows useful labor.

There are other reasons that probably actuate some, such as setting a good example for the younger generation, providing added comforts for loved ones, insuring one's self against incompetency and dependence.

"Dad, why don't you quit?" says the young man to his elderly father or grandfather. But dad hates to give up, thinks he can still be useful, enjoys work and finds much to do. Why should he quit?

GOVERNMENTAL REFORM.

Frank O. Lowden, ex-governor of Illinois, spoke at the University of Oregon last week. Speaking of improvements that could be made in our governmental system he advocated a permanent under-secretary for each department of the national government in order to secure satisfactory administration.

Pointing out the general recognition of the necessity of overhauling the governmental machinery, Mr. Lowden declared that one of the greatest faults in the organization at Washington is the failure to follow the principle of putting into those activities relating to a common subject in any single department. In addition, legislative and judicial boards, outside of departmental jurisdiction, are given administrative functions by congress, which increases the growing complexity and irresponsibility of administration, as, for instance, the Interstate Commerce Commission.

The National Conference on the Science of Politics, of which President Arnold Bennett Hall is one of the founders and leaders, is one of the most hopeful and promising features of modern political science, Mr. Lowden declared. By the scientific methods, which the conference advocates, "we can determine what methods of public administration are economical, efficient and just in their operations and what ones are not," he said. "From the universities must come the research necessary for reform."

"There has never been any man who has given me as much inspiration and stimulation in thinking as your own Arnold Bennett Hall," Mr. Lowden, who is a close friend of Dr. Hall's, declared. Mr. Lowden explained he first came in contact with Dr. Hall after reading the president's book, "Dynamic Americanism," which was published in 1920. He wrote a note to Hall, since he considered the book remarkable, and their friendship began.
